Rev. Francis X. Russo, OFM Capuchin, died on January 14, 2022. Fr. Russo celebrated Masses here at Holy Family for many years. He was beloved by Holy Family parishioners for his gentle smile and pastoral gifts.

I first met Fr. Russo after I arrived here at Holy Family this past July. Like yourselves, I was drawn to this good and holy Priest.

Fr. Russo was a member of the Capuchin Franciscan Friars. Among his many gifts, he spoke Spanish fluently. Though he was in his ninth decade of life, it was not uncommon for Fr. Russo to celebrate four Masses over a weekend at several parishes.

May Fr. Russo, a good man, a holy Priest, rest in eternal peace with the Risen Lord.

As you know, our parish sponsors Shiadrik Mokum, a seminarian who has left his family and country of Cameroon to continue his seminary studies to be ordained for service here in our Archdiocese of Baltimore. Two weeks ago, Shiadrik began the Spring Semester of his Second Year of Theology at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Emmittsburg. After Shiadrik finishes his Spring Semester he will most likely begin his Pastoral Year, spending a full year working in a parish other than Holy Family, continuing to learn about Parish life and ministry.

As I mentioned in my Pastor's note last week, Shiadrik, our seminarian, recently took the Maryland driver's test and got his license but he does not have a vehicle to drive. Knowing that he will most likely begin his Pastoral Year this coming Summer and will need a reliable vehicle, I am asking if any parishioner has a used but mechanically sound vehicle that he/she would be willing to give or sell to Shiadrik so that he will have a vehicle to drive. PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Holy Family is one of three parishes in South County. Historically, what has been its relations to Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Our Lady of Sorrows.

Answer to last week's question about Ordinary time.

Ordinary here refers not to "ordinary" as in every day or ordinary dishes, but to the number system – first, second, third, and so forth. Without going into math theory, Ordinal numbers simply indicate the "order" in which events occur or things are counted. There are 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary time, depending on the date of Easter.
