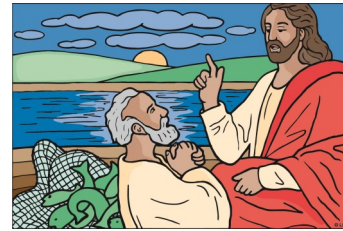

With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. ***You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.***

CARING FOR CREATION MEANS ACTION! Saint James is mentioned twice today, in the second reading and in the Gospel. One of my favorite readings from his letter is Chapter 2 vs 14. **“What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?”** Well there you go, **“Action.”** There are so many opportunities here in Anne Arundel County and Maryland. Watershed Stewards Academy teaches citizens how to organize groups and restore our Watershed to Health. Then there is the Chesapeake Bay foundation and Chesapeake Bay Trust, and the Scenic River Land Trust just to name a few. Some of those offer grants to get projects in the ground and make a difference. Some of us plant oysters on piers in the county in the Spring and return them to the reefs in the Fall. Others pick up trash on the side of the road, plant native trees or pull English Ivy off trees. We understand some folks are so busy at work and raising their families, yet they donate what they can to support the group that touches their hearts. For that, thank you. **Faith works!**

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: When does Lent begin this year?

Answer to last week's question about the weight of the crucifix over the altar: Together the cross and corpus, weigh 280 pounds. Hanging 30 feet above the sanctuary floor it is 10 feet long and 5 feet 5 inches wide. The cross itself was made from mahogany by Dennis Smith from the Eastern Shore while the corpus, body of Christ, was carved from lindenwood in Italy by Conrad Moroder Woodcarvings. Scaffolding was used to hang the crucifix in late 2003. According to the *Catholic Review*, it took 30 volunteers an entire day to clean up the debris afterwards.

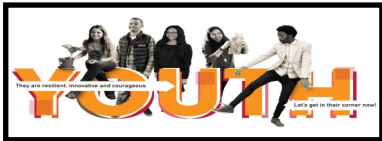
