Dear Friends,

1. This weekend is our **ANNUAL APPEAL FOR CATHOLIC MINISTRIES**. We'll pass out envelopes as people enter the parish building for the Church and hall Masses by ushers wearing rubber gloves. Pencils will be sealed into the envelopes so that you can fill out the forms during Mass and then drop into a basket in the Narthex for those in the Church and a basket in the "Jesus-Mary-Joseph Café" which is the anteroom off of the parish hall. We may or may not have an outdoor Mass that weekend (right now, on Feb. 7, high temp estimated at 34 degrees and snow flurries expected for Feb. 14, so we'll see)!!

2. Also, this weekend, we are inviting parishioners to bring in containers of water (Tupperware or whatever) and we'll **BLESS THAT WATER** so that you can have holy water in your home since we can't keep a big Holy Water container here for multiple people to access on-campus. If you missed the opportunity, please know that I am happy to bless water after Masses at any time.

3. Remember too that Ash Wednesday is coming up on Feb. 17. **SEE THE SCHEDULE OF MASSES/DISTRIBUTION TIMES ON THE BOTTOM RIGHT CORNER OF THIS PAGE.** Please go to www.holyfamilychurch.com to register **OR** call Donna at the Parish Office (ext. 35) if you do not use a computer. **THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE AND WE ARE SORRY WE HAVE TO DO THIS.** Please note that the 6:30am Church Mass, the 12 noon simultaneous Unity Hall services (not Masses) and the 5pm Mass **OUTSIDE** will **NOT** require pre-registration. All other services will require pre-registration.

4. We are have daily reflection books for Lent (**FREE**) available on the weekend of Feb. 13-14. We'll have them at all the in-person Masses in the Church and Unity Hall on tables, spread out, in the Narthex and in the JMJ lounge area adjacent to the Hall respectively. After the 11:15am **OUTSIDE** Mass we'll ask everyone to **EXIT THE LOT** by driving by the **PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY** side of the lot and there we will have people wearing rubber gloves and masks handing out the books to people in their cars as they drive by.

◆ Fr. Andy will be in the parking lot, on the Prince George's County side of the lot, for anyone to drive by to get a booklet and a pre-Lenten blessing from 12:15-1:45pm that day. This will be especially for anyone who is not yet attending Mass in person, but who would like to come down to get a book and a blessing.

◆ You can also come by the parish office when it is open to pick up a book.

◆ We will also have a parishioner who is happy to deliver little books with **DAILY REFLECTIONS FOR LENT AND HOLY WEEK** (Feb. 17 – Apr. 4) to the home of parishioners/non-involved Catholics who aren't getting out of their homes right now or even just an interested neighbor who is a shut-in. They can deliver the book to the door though we are holding off from them coming into the home. Let Donna in the parish office know at office@hfccmail.org and we'll get the word to our **"Lenten reflection book deliverer."**

PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**



STEWARDSHIP: Offertory donations are essential for Holy Family's parish operations. We rely heavily on the Sunday offertory to maintain operational budgets, and fund staff positions and outreach activities in our community. Many of you

have asked how to continue your support while you are unable to attend Mass in person. Holy Family uses Faith Direct to facilitate electronic giving directly to the parish accounts. If you are not already enrolled in Faith Direct you can use this link <https://membership.faithdirect.net/MD61> or use the link on the Holy Family website. You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. You may also mail your offertory envelopes to the Church office at Holy Family, PO Box 130, Davidsonville, MD 21035. But the Canticle is more than poetry; it is the work of a mystic, arising from a spiritual depths of love. It is the song of living in the family of creation. Answer to last week's question about the date for Ash Wednesday: Since Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent, it's date is determined by the date for Easter, which the Church has set as the Sunday of the first full moon **AFTER** the Spring equinox. Since the full moon is March 27th, Easter is early this year, April 4th. Ash Wednesday is the Wednesday before the full six weeks of Lent, so this year the date is February 17th.

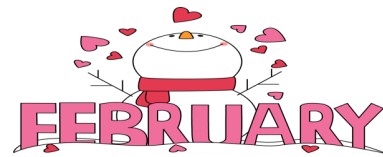
