CARING FOR CREATION MEANS YOU ... MOST DAYS! | take Maddie and Sophie for a walk right up the street at Riva Park. This time of year is a great time to look out for invasive vines growing on trees. English Ivy is easy to spot because it's one of the few green things growing along the forest edges right now besides American Holly. Be careful because poison ivy is often growing along with English Ivy. Poison ivy has bare branches growing 90° from the tree bark this time of year. Soon you will see those "distinctive 3 leaves." Indeed, to those who are allergic to it, it's still quite concerning. During a couple of these heavy snowfall events this year, I saw many trees and branches come down by the weight of the snow, that were covered in English Ivy. Fortunately here at Church we've already removed all the ivy on our trees. Another vine, Porcelain Berry, looks identical to our native Grape Ivy which grows naturally in our forests. It is easy to identify with its multicolored fruits in the Fall. Porcelain Berry likes exactly the same habitat as our native grape with all green fruit. What is different is, it emerges earlier in the Spring, along with other invasives and will grow much faster and grow much taller than the grape cousin. In fact, it grows so fast that it can smother and kill mature trees in a few years. Some others worth mentioning include Wisteria, Asian Bittersweet and Kudzu which was introduced for erosion control. So, feel free to search your woodlands for these invasives
