DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Question: What was the "Biggest Miracle" of Saint Patrick?

Answer to last week's question about why the forty days of penance before Easter is called Lent is derived from the English lencten meaning "Spring Season." In the English speaking world, "Lent" is used to designate what in Latin are the days before Easter, "Quadragesima", meaning "Fortieth."

LENTEN REGULATIONS: **Abstinence** from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.
