DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Why did Jesus enter Jerusalem riding on not just a donkey, but a foal, a young colt not yet ridden?

Answer to last week's question about St. Joseph's age: We don't know. Scripture is silent. However, two traditions have developed over time. In the Orthodox Church Joseph was an old but vigorous man when he married the Virgin Mary. Many biblical scholars now believe he was young, possibly a teenager since in Jesus' time that was the norm for Jewish newlyweds. **Bishop Fulton Sheen once wrote that he believed that Joseph was in the "morning of life, bubbling over with energy, strength, and controlled passion."**

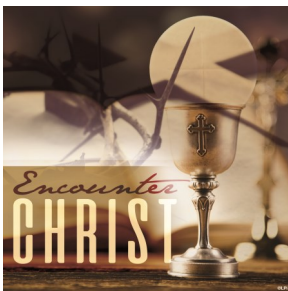
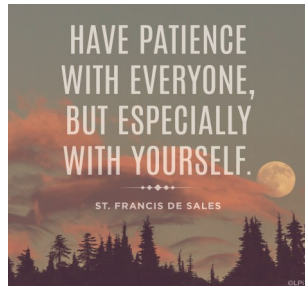
