HOLY FAMILY

Dear Friends,

Please pray for all of our young people getting their First Communion or Confirmation this spring. While they are preparing, let's all recall our own need to **RENEW OUR OWN FAITH AS WE GO THROUGH OUR LIVES.**

This is what the 50 days from Easter to Pentecost are about. After the **"40 day retreat"** of Lent to get us ready for Easter, during the 50 days of Easter, we try to focus on appreciating the **CORE** of what we were baptized into. That our faith has its foundation on the fact that at Easter Jesus rose from the dead, in the face of the brutal and sadistic death He experienced at the hand of the strongest Empire of the world at that time (Rome) and His disciples transformed from a scared and scattered band of people hiding in the shadows, to a group that fanned out across the world from India to Spain, all preaching that Jesus was God and Messiah and that He had risen from the dead, even in the face of torture and death. In the end, all but one would die at the hands of those who did not want to hear their message, but they preached it anyway.

So, we were baptized into this faith with water in the Sacrament called Baptism, and since we celebrate the core of what we were baptized into at Easter (that Jesus is God and has risen from the dead) it is an option at Mass to sprinkle holy water at liturgies (Masses) during the 50 days we call the Easter Season.

That's what we are doing at Masses here at Holy Family all during that time. We are sprinkling holy water to remind us that we were baptized into a faith that says that Jesus **REALLY DID** rise from the dead and who **REALLY IS** God.

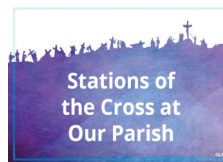

STEWARDSHIP: Offertory donations are essential for Holy Family's parish operations. We rely heavily on the Sunday offertory to maintain operational budgets, and fund staff positions and outreach activities in our community. Many of you

have asked how to continue your support while you are unable to attend Mass in person. Holy Family uses Faith Direct to facilitate electronic giving directly to the parish accounts. If you are not already enrolled in Faith Direct you can use this link <https://membership.faithdirect.net/MD61> or use the link on the Holy Family website. You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. You may also mail your offertory envelopes to the Church office at Holy Family, PO Box 130, Davidsonville, MD 21035. STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY:

Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize

your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. CARING FOR CREATION means people too. We are all getting excited about Spring and all the flowers we see, as we walk in the woods, that are appearing or will be planted in our gardens. During this other rebirth you will begin to hear about our Church's new mission to support The Light House-A Homeless Prevention Support Center. Many of us just call it the Light House in Annapolis. This is a Spring event going on in the Narthex now where you will see a box for our shoe drive. Currently, the Lighthouse is providing meals and overnight living support for 25 otherwise homeless clients. Pre-Covid they supported 50 or so clients and like everywhere, spacing rules limits participants. Unlike Winter Relief, which is a county wide program, The Lighthouse is supporting our neighbors just up the road.



What can YOU do? You can bring, preferably "new" or even "gently" used size 7 to 16 walking/running/athletic shoes to our donation bin at Church or under the blue grocery carts. Please leave those oxfords, heels, and dirty old sneakers at home. If you need someone to come and pick them up, we can arrange that too. CARING FOR CREATION: Hummingbirds will start arriving in the next two weeks! They will need energy for their migration north, so get those feeders ready. Remember that homemade nectar is best, no dyes or flavoring, just water (1c.) and pure sugar (1/4c.) are best. Fresh nectar every other day!

When the temperature is consistently above 80 degrees feeders should be flushed with hot water every 3 days or so and refilled. In a pot of hot water dissolve as much sugar as you can. 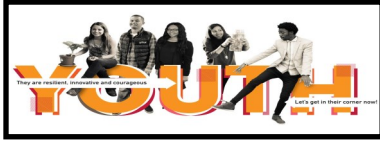
