STEWARDSHIP: Offertory donations are essential for Holy Family's parish operations. We rely heavily on the Sunday offertory to maintain operational budgets, and fund staff positions and outreach activities in our community. Many of you have asked how to continue your support while you are unable to attend Mass in person. Holy Family uses Faith Direct to facilitate electronic giving directly to the parish accounts. You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. The Mysteries of the Rosary

Have you ever wanted to explore the life of Jesus and Mary in a deeper way? Each decade highlights a sacred episode:

Joyful Mysteries: Through the Annunciation (1) and Visitation (2), we get a glimpse at Mary's joyful yes to God. She gives birth to Jesus in the Nativity (3). Mary and Joseph present their son at the temple (4) and bring him there again when he is a teenager (5).

Luminous Mysteries: Jesus is baptized in the Jordan River (1) before Mary gives him a nudge to his first miracle at Cana (2). Jesus proclaims the Gospel (3), is transfigured on Mount Tabor (4), and institutes the Eucharist (5). The light is shining!

Sorrowful Mysteries: Jesus prays in agony in Gethsemane (1), knowing his hour of suffering has come. After his betrayal and arrest, Jesus is scourged (2) and crowned with thorns (3). He carries his cross (4), and Mary stands at the foot of the cross as he is crucified (5).

Glorious Mysteries: Christ is risen in glory (1)! After appearing to those he loves, he ascends into heaven (2). Jesus' followers receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (3). Mary, unaffected by original sin, is assumed body and soul into heaven (4), where she is crowned queen, humble mother of Christ the King (5).

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A:

Question: What is the Octave of Easter?

Answer to last week's question about the egg as a symbol of Easter. Eggs have a lengthy tradition as an Easter symbol within the Christian Church, both east and west. The egg is the symbol of new life from an apparently inanimate object. A pastor once observed: "You'd never know what's going on inside, just as when you look at the outside of the tomb you assume there are only dead bones inside. But new life breaks forth from the egg, and obviously that is the symbol of the Resurrection, coming forth from something that appears dead and inanimate." As early as 400 AD Christians in the Middle East were the first to use eggs as an Easter symbol and there certainly are Jewish roots. The egg is also included in the Jewish Passover Seder since ancient time.

SEW ANGELS: We have received an urgent request from several area facilities for the need of sewn masks including AAMC (see attached email/pattern). If you are able to make some of these at home and can drop them off to either Pam or Barbara (addresses

below) and leave on our porches we will make sure they get to those in need. They are very easy to make and sew up quickly. If you need fabric please let us know and we will leave on our porches for you as well. If you don't sew, but would like to cut out fabric, the sizes are 9x6 inches and we need two pieces of fabric per mask (100% cotton). If you use flannel for one side – prewash the flannel as it shrinks. Some are also inserting light interfacing in between the layers to give the mask shape/filter. Please let us know if you have any questions. You can also make ties/binding instead of elastic (20") across top and bottom if you don't have the elastic available.

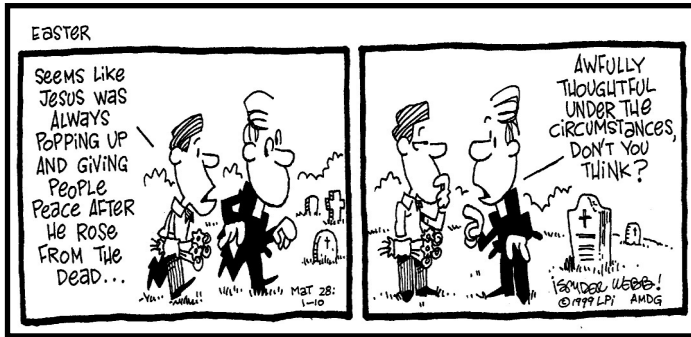

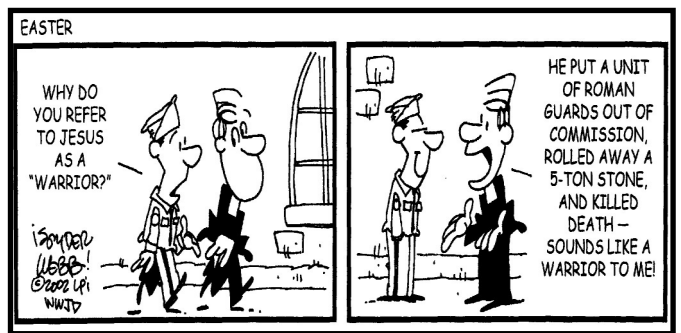
