~ Pastor's Note ~

At the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday Night, four adults Tammy Kelley, Madeline Madsen, Candace Turner and Kenny Turner were Baptized, Confirmed and received the Lord Jesus for the first time in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. In addition, Carolyn Howard and Thomas Trepanier were also Confirmed. Congratulations to these adults who are now fully initiated, having each received the three Sacraments of Initiation.

I thank the team members of our RCIA Ministry (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) led by Charles Burk and their sponsors for journeying in faith with these six adult men and women since last September.

I thank all the parishioners who contributed in so many wonderful ways to our celebration of Holy Week and Easter here at Holy Family; sacristans; ushers; eucharistic ministers; those parishioners who assisted with the outdoor Masses; cantors; leaders and members of our Liturgical Choir, Men's Choir and the Contemporary Choir. My gratitude also goes to the members of our Liturgy Planning Committee who decorated our Church so beautifully throughout Holy Week and on Easter Sunday. I also thank Fr. Chris Moore, our two deacons and all of our Parish Staff members who assisted with our services and Masses.

Seminarian Shiadrik Mokum was a big help to me throughout Holy Week and on Easter. Shiadrik left his family back in Cameroon to come to our Archdiocese of Baltimore to complete his studies and pastoral formation to be ordained a priest and serve here. Shiadrik is now completing his Second Year of Theology at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Emmittsburg and in June will begin his Pastoral Year at St. John the Evangelist in Severna Park. Throughout these twelve months, Shiadrik will serve on the Parish Staff of St. John's, gaining experience of parish life by being a fulltime member of a parish staff. In August of 2023, Shiadrik will return to the Mount for his Third Year of Theology. Please keep Shiadrik in your daily prayers as he begins his Pastoral Year this coming June.

In regards to the 2003 vehicle which our parish purchased for Shiadrik, I am happy to report that the vehicle passed Maryland State Inspection! I thank parishioner Paul Acito who did work on the vehicle so that it would be a reliable and safe vehicle for Shiadrik. I also thank parishioner Theresa Niffenegger who found the vehicle and then contacted me.

There are other seminarians in our Archdiocese who are also in need of safe and reliable used vehicles. So, if you know of such a vehicle, please contact me.

As we continue the celebration of the Easter Season, next Saturday, May 7th we will celebrate two large group celebrations of First Communion here at Holy Family for our children. Please pray for these boys and girls as they each receive the Real Presence of Jesus Christ for the first time in the Holy Eucharist. Pray also for their parents who are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith.

Lastly, I encourage you to participate in the ongoing parish survey regarding possible uses for the now closed Post Office Building which our parish owns and is adjacent to our campus situated on the lower right side as you drive onto our campus. Members of our Post Office Committee have been meeting since before Christmas to examine possible uses of this building. Because that is usually what we notice first with the arrival of these beautiful birds. It's the sound they make hovering with their wings at the feeder or feeding on the flowers in the garden. Once again, I am blessed to see God's gifts of Spring, a renewal of Life and of Hope!

Answer to the question, how long is the Easter Season? It lasts 50 days, from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. It is celebrated as a single joyful feast, called the "great Lord's Day". Each Sunday of the season is treated as a Sunday of Easter.

Note that we celebrate 50 days of Easter compared to 40 days of Lent!
