Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the readings today for the Sixth Sunday of Easter, Year A, Jesus mentions his own self, the Holy Spirit and the Father in short order. So, this text is an interesting one to uphold our teaching about God being a Trinity of persons – all God, and yet reaching out to us with love and loving one another. *Jesus says: 1.* He will send the Holy Spirit to be with us always. 2. That if we keep Jesus' commandments that means we love Jesus and that if we love him we will be loved by the Father. 3. Jesus will also love us and reveal himself to us.

So, today we see this threefold way that Jesus says that God will reach out to us: Through the Holy Spirit, through the Father and through the Son.

We also emphasize, in the Catholic faith, that we are part of a loving Church that is a family and so we are loved by others here on earth through the family of the Church and we are prayed for by the loving family of the saints in heaven.

For all of this love, however, sometimes we don't experience this love and it doesn't touch our hearts.

This is a mystery but I have talked to people over the years who simply report not having had the experience of this love of God or the presence of God whether through the Holy Spirit, God the Father, Jesus, the saints or through other Christians and their prayer or witness.

The only thing I can say is that the love is what we need to keep trying and to keep taking the chance to expose ourselves to faith.

I am reminded of a saint named Camillus de Lellis, whose Feast Day is July 14th. He is a patron saint of health-care workers. In looking at his life I noticed that he wasn't that religious as a young man (or maybe not at all). He spent a long time in the army for the Republic of Venice. He lived in the 1500's and had no intention of getting involved in religion, but then he gambled away all his savings and ended up taking a job as a laborer, as fate would have it, at a house occupied by Capuchin Franciscan priests. Well, they worked on him. But even working all day around this group of priests who were trying to sway him to have faith it took a *WHILE*...but he did finally have an experience of faith that touched his heart....and after that he was off to the races!! He ended up becoming a priest and starting his own religious order that cared for the sick.

So, I guess I am trying to say it's out there....let's keep pondering the beautiful message of our faith and trying to put **LOVE FIRST** in our lives. Loving God and loving our neighbor as ourselves.

Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. You may also mail your offertory envelopes to the Church office at Holy Family, PO Box 130, Davidsonville, MD 21035. PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.



STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY: Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your

deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. Answer to the question about the saint who fearlessly served the sick: Damien of Molokai was Belgium. Damien was the religious name Jozef De Veuster took when he entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. He was ordained in Hawaii in 1863 and worked with the leper colony guarantined on the island of Molokai from 1873 until his death from leprosy in 1889 after contracting leprosy himself four years earlier. He was canonized in 2009.
