HOLY FAMILY

Dear Friends,

This weekend we remember Memorial Day on Monday, May 31st. This is a day to appreciate the sacrifices that many in our armed forces have made in service to our country. It is a good practice to recall those who put aside their own comfort and security in order to serve. Let us let their courage inspire us today to build up our country as best we can in our own time.

This coming Thursday, June 3rd we will have a special rosary in the Church at 6:30pm followed by Mass at 7pm. The event is a **“Consecration to the Virgin Mary.”** This **“consecration”** is about us first following the example of saying **“yes”** to God’s will in our lives like Mary did and, second, asking that Mary pray for us as we try to follow her Son. Catholics always keep in mind that Jesus wanted us to **HELP EACH OTHER** in the walk of faith as Christians....and so we are part of a Church where we hope to inspire others and to be inspired by others and we ask for the prayers of the saints in our journey. So, this Consecration Mass, to which you are invited, is a reminder that being a Christian is not a solo effort.

Then on June 4th we get a seminarian with us for the summer, Khoa Tran (Quah). He is from Vietnam and came here only last August. He is studying for the Archdiocese of Baltimore. Please keep him in your prayers and offer him a warm welcome.

Finally, on Sunday June 6th following the 11:15am Masses in the Church and outside we will have a procession for Corpus Christi/Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We will process from the back balcony over to the Chapel and then around the campus. Those attending Mass in the Church on Sunday are also invited to join in our procession as well as those who attended other Masses that weekend or watched virtually. We will have a short time of Adoration on the lawn in front of the Church where the traffic circle is for people to pray outside on that day.

This year, for the first time, we are using a **CANOPY** over the Monstrance held by four people as we walk made by Mr. Gerry Coffman and Sew Time for the procession. It is an old tradition to do this.

CARING FOR CREATION MINISTRY: A few years ago we were mowing the two storm water ponds at the back of the Church. I don't have any pictures, but it looked like someone's very nice lawn in front of their house. We paid

to have it cut every other week so it would look tidy. Today it looks a little less tidy. There are some native wild flowers there now including Dogbane, a milkweed and Asters. During the summer we see birds, butterflies and bees visiting the area. So, the operative word is some. I have already begun to introduce some more diversity to the ponds. If anyone wants to bring some natives, I am thinking Butterfly Milkweed, Coneflower, Blackeyed Susan, we can certainly find a place for them and maybe there is a place in your own landscape. By the way, Butterfly Bush is not a native, but imported from the far east and is an invasive species. You can plant your native flowers or if you really want me too, leave them at the office and I will ask the youth group to plant them for you. Finally, we have cicadas at our house. The dogs, Sophie & Maddie love them, my wife, Mary Ann, not so much!

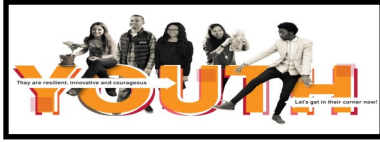
