~ *Pastor's Note* ~

First and foremost **"Happy Father's Day"** to all our Fathers, Grandfathers, Godfathers and to those men who have taken on this vocation with a Father's love and dedication!

We had a beautiful sunny but not too hot of a day for our Parish Picnic last Sunday. We had a good turnout of parishioners who enjoyed listening to the music, sharing good food, drinks and fellowship. The children enjoyed jumping in the moon bounce and throwing softballs at the bullseye target to send anyone, including myself, sitting on the seat cascading into the dunking tank waters. One of the most enjoyed activities of the day for our younger members was the balloon toss!

I thank the Knights of Columbus who began setting up early Sunday morning and grilled the hamburgers and hot dogs, the women and men who helped work in the kitchen and decorated Unity Hall so beautifully. I thank the parish staff members who assisted with the picnic. Lastly, I thank the staff members and the parishioners who stayed for the clean up and break down at the end of the afternoon. **We are already planning the 2024 Parish Picnic!**

If you are reading this early, this Saturday, June 17th, we will welcome Archbishop William Lori here to Holy Family. During his pastoral visit to our parish, Archbishop Lori will lead us in celebrating the Eucharist at the 5pm Mass that day. After the Mass, we will have a reception for the Archbishop in Unity Hall. I invite you to join us for this Mass with Archbishop Lori and the reception following.

I leave on this coming Monday, June 19th for a spiritual retreat with my fellow priests at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore. The retreat will end on Friday, June 23rd. There will be Daily Communion Services at 9am on Monday thru Friday in the Church. Since I will be away, there will be no Sacrament of Reconciliation offered on Wednesday, June 21st.

I share with you an update on our HVAC Campaign. As of this past Sunday, June 11th, we have received \$65,715.12. These gifts combined with the \$50,000 from our reserve fund, gives us a total of \$115,715.12 or 18% towards our goal of \$630,000! We are tracking our parish's progress in our HVAC Campaign with the two red thermometers in our narthex. The thermometers are on the two brick walls on the far right or left of the double doors that lead into our Church.

Every dollar given during this two year campaign is cathedraic free, which means every dollar will go toward the purchase and installation of our new HVAC System. If you would like to make your contribution thru Faith Direct, you can contribute to the maintenance collection on Faith Direct. If you would like assistance in choosing this option for the campaign, feel free to call the Parish Office. Thank you for your support!

The school year in Anne Arundel County came to a close this past Tuesday. With parishioners starting to take summer vacations, we will begin our summer Mass schedule starting the weekend of July 1st & 2nd thru August 26th & 27th. The Mass schedule will be as follows: **Saturday Vigil Mass - 5pm, Sunday Masses - 8:30am & 10:30am.** On the first weekend in September we will return to our regular Mass schedule.

Lastly, at the start of the Covid Pandemic, the sharing of the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ was stopped. Starting next month in July, the sharing of the second species will be offered at all weekend Masses. If you have a cold or are feeling under the weather, I would ask you to not receive from the chalice.

CARING FOR CREATION MEANS: So, poison ivy, believe it or not is one of the good guys. Many of you may have noticed it growing along the tree lines as you walk around in your gardens or at the park. It is an important food source for our native birds, who, after the plant

flowers, grow seeds for them to eat. That is why you'll find it popping up all over the place in strange places.

It really thrives in the sun-shade areas at the tree line. If you look at the photograph, you'll see those three leaves and their very distinctive shape. These light colored ones represent brand new leaflets. As it gets older as the Summer goes along they'll get a deep shiny green. In the fall a deep red.

At any time they can cause a severe rash. If I have to work in or around it, I wear long sleeves, long pants and gloves. Throwing them immediately into the wash machine when I'm done. I know, I know there are folks out there that are not allergic to poison ivy. Good for them. The rest of us have to be very careful.

Finally, I have no problem removing poison ivy in areas where children and pets can come in contact with them. There's plenty of it around.

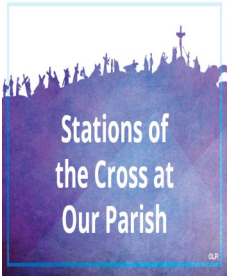

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A



QUESTION: In a national survey of Catholics in 2019 in which the Pew Research Center asked about belief in the actual presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, what percentage said they believed it to be only a symbol?

Answer to question about the stained-glass window with the Dove: Window Seven connects the Dove in Genesis 8 (Noah and the Ark) with the Holy Spirit descending on Jesus as a Dove at His baptism by John. (This window is a bit difficult to see behind and to the left of the altar).

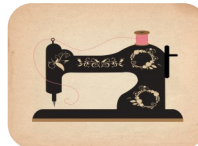
NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

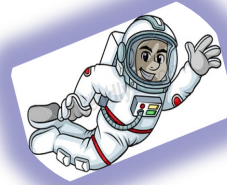
