

CARING FOR CREATION MINISTRY: Did you know that mosquitos are out in full force in August? Of course you do. Some thoughts for your consideration. Removing standing water is your first line of defense. Some of the spots to look

for standing water are clogged gutters, outside flower pots trays, birdbaths, plastic tarps and low spots in the yard. Some Mosquitoes can lay eggs that will hatch in 48 hours and emerge as larva. You can see them wiggling around in the water. Ponds with fish, flowing creeks and streams are seldom a problem. Spraying pesticides is one of the last things to consider. They generally kill all insects that are in the environment which is food for our wildlife. Yes, they kill butterflies. Fish, Praying Mantis, Bluebirds, Purple Martins, Dragon Flies, Swallows and Bats are all voracious mosquito predators. Some mosquitoes you might see around here are Salt Marsh, Yellow Fever and Asian Tiger mosquitos. What to do? Change your birdbath water every couple days, check your pots and fill in those low spots. Early in the morning and late evening are the mosquitoes most active times. Mosquitoes are attracted to carbon dioxide and lactic acid in sweat, but I would not suggest giving up on breathing just yet.
