Dear Brother's & Sister's,

Please be aware of a few things:

- ◆ Next weekend (Sept. 5-6) after every Mass young people can take holy cards with St. Thomas Aquinas, Patron Saint of Students and Teachers, from tables in the Narthex. They will be separated out and disinfected before Masses – not in a basket where they could be touched by others. Please have your young people who are students take a card to keep at their computer for their work this Fall.
- ◆ Also, after the 11:15am Mass next weekend (Sept. 6) we'll have a **KOANA ICE TRUCK** in the back lot. You can get a cup of ice after Mass on the parish.
- ◆ Religious Education classes start Sept. 20-21. Please sign your kids up as soon as is possible for EITHER virtual or in-person classes. Just go to holyfamilychurch.com and scroll down to the image "**Faith Formation**" you can sign them up. Please know that we have scholarship money available if money is an issue.
- ◆ For students in the second grade, please remember to sign them up for First Reconciliation prep classes. This is also for Catholic home school and Catholic school students.
- ◆ For students in the 9th grade, please remember to sign them up for Confirmation. Again, this is also for Catholic home school and Catholic school students.
- ◆ There are also many upcoming adult ed. programs. Check the website, bulletin and a mailing we are sending out (through snail mail) with all of that information.

PLEASE SIGN YOUR KIDS UP FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION CLASSES AT HOLY FAMILY:

I would like to reach out to the parents who have children in grades 1 through 9 and encourage you to enroll your young people in the parish programs.

Please know that for the in-person classes, we are going to be very diligent in following disinfecting procedures, wearing masks and also in observing social distancing. Anne Arundel County was requiring 50% capacity, we are putting ours at 30% capacity.

Also, GATHERING YOUR CHILD WITH A COMMITTED SET OF TEACHERS AND WITH OTHER YOUNG PEOPLE WHO WANT TO GROW IN THEIR FAITH IS PRICELESS.

Yesterday, I got a note from someone about how their relative was going to "ask" a 10 year-old if they "wanted" to go to Religious Ed. class, and that if the young person said "no" that the young person wasn't going to go. I wondered why we would take that approach when we wouldn't let our young person "decide" to only eat desserts for now on, only sugary foods...or to let them decide to not enroll in regular school if they "didn't want to." Indeed, how many kids would take the option of skipping regular school all the time if they were allowed to do that?

So, I know it's tough, but maybe sweeten the deal by going out to brunch or doing something special if you are wanting them to go to classes this year – virtual or in-person. Because to be around other kids and people who love their faith and to talk about their faith with others gives them something that no book or video ever can – a friendship and connection to people of faith that can help them to see where **THEY** sit with their own personal faith.

Indeed, I do feel that there is a need for young people, **MORE THAN EVER RIGHT NOW**, to have a personal experience of faith...and to have teachers and other young people in their lives who value their faith and who can impact your child/young person with how to pray and to learn to see Christ in themselves and every person they meet, and to understand their faith.

In the end, we will generally have class about 3 times a month for seven months – so maybe that's 25 hours of their life during the coming school year to be with others to learn about their faith in the whole year. Is that too much? NO. I think they need more. But, to not even get them that much because a ten-year-old decides they don't want to do that? Well, maybe their parents have a bit more life experience to know it's important for them. **Please sign them up.**

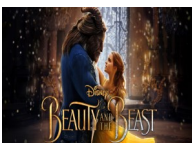
PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**



STEWARDSHIP: Offertory donations are essential for Holy Family's parish operations. We rely heavily on the Sunday offertory to maintain operational budgets, and fund staff positions and outreach activities in our community. Many of you have asked how to continue your support while you are unable to attend Mass in person. Holy Family uses Faith Direct to facilitate electronic giving directly to the parish accounts. You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. CARING FOR CREATION MINISTRY

LAWN 101: *Did you know* it is time to look at your lawn if you have one and prepare for a Fall renovation. I know some folks think they are evil and I get it. But the

truth is a little more complex than that. Lawns with the right seed and minimal use of chemicals and fertilizer can be a valuable asset to our environment. Grass can prevent erosion and slow down water in the landscape. If you have ever seen our rivers and streams looking like chocolate milk, smothering our fish and crabs and submersible grass habitat, you can be sure the mud and dirt did not come from lawns. My grass is down to less than 25% of the yard as garden beds keep expanding with native plants and flowers. Bees, birds and butterflies are daily visitors that bring joy every day. I digress. Fall is the best time to improve your lawn. Thanks to our progressive legislators, the #1 polluter, phosphorus was removed from lawn fertilizer a decade ago. For any product you use on your lawn, please read the instructions carefully. Particularly, when rain is in the forecast, it can save you money and our environment. You should be thinking about seeding or over seeding as soon as possible, when all the prep work is done. The internet has lots of guidance on the steps you could take. The important thing is to get the grass seed sprouted and growing as soon as possible so it will be well established before Fall and when leaves are all over the landscape.
