#### Dear Brother's & Sister's,

#### Please be aware of a few things:

- This weekend (Sept. 5-6) after every Mass young people can take holy cards with St. Thomas Aquinas, Patron Saint of Students and Teachers, from tables in the Narthex. They will be separated out and disinfected before Masses - not in a basket where they could be touched by others. Please have your young people who are students take a card to keep at their computer for their work this Fall.
- Also, after the 11:15am Mass this weekend (Sept. 6) we'll have a KOANA ICE TRUCK in the back lot. You can get a cup of ice after Mass on the parish.
- Religious Education classes start Sept. 20-21. Please sign your kids up as soon as is possible for EITHER virtual or inperson classes. Just go to holyfamilychurch.com and scroll down to the image "Faith Formation" you can sign them up. Please know that we have scholarship money available if money is an issue.
- For students in the second grade, please remember to sign them up for First Reconciliation prep classes. This is also for Catholic home school and Catholic school students.
- For students in the  $9^{\text{th}}$  grade, please remember to sign them up for Confirmation. Again, this is also for Catholic home school and Catholic school students.
- There are also many upcoming adult ed. programs. Check the website, bulletin and a mailing we are sending out (through snail mail) with all of that information.

#### PLEASE SIGN YOUR KIDS UP FOR RELIGIOUS SACRAMENTAL **EDUCATION** AND **PREPARATION CLASSES AT HOLY FAMILY:**

I would like to reach out to the parents who have children in grades 1 through 9 and encourage you to enroll your young people in the parish programs.

Please know that for the in-person classes, we are going to be very diligent in following disinfecting procedures, wearing masks and also in observing social distancing. Anne Arundel County was requiring 50% capacity, we are putting ours at 30% capacity.

#### Also, **GATHERING** YOUR CHILD COMMITTED SET OF TEACHERS AND WITH OTHER YOUNG PEOPLE WHO WANT TO GROW IN THEIR FAITH IS PRICELESS.

In the end, we will generally have class about 3 times a month for seven months - so maybe that's 25 hours of their life during the coming school year to be with others to learn about their faith in the whole year. Is that too much? NO. I think they need more. But, to not even get them that much because a tenyear-old decides they don't want to do that? Well, maybe their parents have a bit more life experience to know it's important for them. Please sign them up.

FINALLY, A WORD ABOUT THE DIGNITY OF LIFE FROM TWO DIFFERENT PERSEPECTIVES: On the weekend of Sept. 19 and 20 our parish will remember the dignity of human life through two events: One promoting an alternative to abortion and the other through discussing the issue of racism.

- 1. We'll have a walk to support an alternative to abortion through supporting the Pregnancy Center in Annapolis (Sept.
- 2. We'll have a gathering at Holy Family called "Bringing Us All Together As One Family" to address the issue of racism on Sept. 20 through inspirational song, prayer and the sharing of the stories of a couple of parishioners.

CARING FOR CREATION MINISTRY: Did you know I finally saw our first lightning bugs of the summer? I don't know, it seems they were with us all summer log during those lazy days of

summer as a child. While I personally grow native plants as much as possible and create a welcoming local habitat in our gardens, some of our neighbors do not. At least two of them spray for mosquitoes which cannot be good for any of the insects that feed our birds, bats and dragonflies or the lightning bugs either. There is some good news on the horizon though. Scientists are using Crisper to modify the DNA to prevent mosquitoes from transmitting disease. Over 1 million people die of Dengue, Malaria and other mosquito born diseases world wide with up to 500 million sickened according to the WHO. We do not want to or even to try to kill all of them because they are such an important part of the food train. One day those girls may just be a mild irritant kept at bay with an insect repellant. I digress. Did you know there are over 2,000 species of fireflies throughout the world. Their light is created by a chemical reaction between luciferase and luciferin in a process called bioluminescence. Once again the girl bug comes into play. She is the one that flies around and searches for a male perched on a branch or blade of This part of their life cycle lasts only a couple weeks. Baby firefly larvae spend a couple years underground hunting snails worms and slugs. where the chemicals we use in our landscape today can have a significant impact on lightning bugs not just this year but next year and the next year...
