**DEACON DOUG'S Q & A:** October is the Month of the Rosary. What major historical event is often credited with this Church declaration?

Answer to the question about diocesan priests and the vow of poverty: No, priests of a given diocese, unlike those in religious orders like the Redemptorists, Franciscans, do not take vows, they make "promises" of obedience to their bishop, chastity and to pray the Liturgy of the Hours. Their main work is preaching the

Gospel, offering Mass, anointing the sick and dying, baptizing, celebrating marriages, burying the dead and consoling those who need his help. Since they are focused on the needs of their parish in order to fulfill their duties and live independently, priests usually own a car and other possessions.
