We will still have the Saturday Mass at 5pm, and the Sunday 7:45am & 9:15am Masses in the Church. **The only change is that there will be no 11:00am Sunday Mass in the Church.**

I have seen a Sears and Roebuck home in Ellicott City, Maryland but I have never seen a Chapel before coming to Holy Family. Our Parish bought the kit from the Sears and Roebuck Company. The Chapel was delivered in boxes and I presume assembled by Parishioners. As far as I know, our Chapel is the only Sears and Roebuck Chapel in the Archdiocese.

I invite you to stop by the Chapel and visit with Jesus in its peace and simple beauty. The Chapel is open for visits at anytime, day or night.

Answer to last week's question about the first priests at Holy Family: The first priests were Marists, members of the French order of mission priests who saw rural Maryland as potentially fruitful mission territory at the time. Even though the Marists started a school to train priests, they decided to leave in 1900. From then until 1926 the Franciscans provided priests to work under the Archdiocese in serving the Dodon community. In 1926, the community was placed under St. Mary's in Annapolis as the Mission of Holy Family.

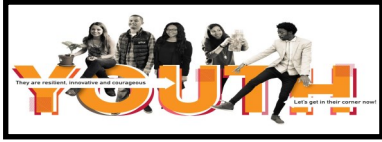
