Truly a blessing.

Boom, crash, thunk, pop-pop-pop, bang, wham, clang, kerpow. Ping, oh that's the sound when the acorns hits the neighbor's aluminum boat. Pop-pop-pop-pop, oh that's when the lovely wife, Mary Ann, drives away to go to the store. Thump when they hit the roof. Clang, one hits the hood of the neighbor's car. Trying to keep the sidewalk and driveway clear so no one slips and falls.

So, what is this all about? First off, I bet you can't believe I can squeeze one more column out of the cicadas, but here we are. The female cicadas laid eggs in the small tips of many of our trees last summer and at least around here seems to prefer the oak trees. Eventually, the weakened branches break off and fall to the ground. The baby cicadas have hatched and now burrow into the ground to feed on the roots of the trees, only to emerge in 17 years. So, every few years particularly in times of drought or stress the oak trees put out a significant number of acorns and that's what's happening here. Just wondering what's happening at your house.

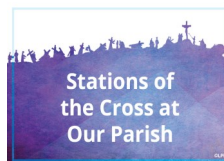
