Dear Brothers & Sisters,

We will be continuing our **NOVENA FOR OUR NATION**, which started Oct. 10, and finishes on Oct. 18. Please pray along with the novena prayers and intentions each day (you can go to www.holyfamilychurch.com to view the prayers) and please join us for two public rosaries this weekend, Oct. 17-18, just like we did Oct. 10-11.

We will be saying the rosary, as a parish, before the 5pm Mass in the Church (at 4:30pm) and before the 11:15am Mass – outside, rear parking lot (at 10:45am). It would be great to have a strong showing for these rosaries and a powerful witness to prayer, so please come and pray for our nation at these times!

A little about the financial situation of the parish:

I wanted to thank you for your support to Holy Family Parish in the last year. This year has been one where we have had a lot of extraordinary experiences, with the Covid-19 pandemic, then the quarantine, and our life in the midst of the pandemic ever since.

Despite all of this, I am very proud of our parish and thankful that our parishioners stepped up to support our continuing work in the parish in-person and also virtually.

We did end up last fiscal year, however, (July 1, 2019-June 30, 2020) a little behind where we want to be, and are a little off where we want to be in the current fiscal year. The specifics are being mailed to every registered parish individual or family and then also sent out by flocknote.

But I am keeping it a little bit simpler in this pastor's note, and just letting you know that we are a little behind. Because of that we are asking you to consider two things: First, to sign up for our electronic giving. You can sign up by going to www.holyfamilychurch.com and scrolling down on the home page until you see a box labelled "**Faith Direct.**" Just click on that box and follow the instructions.

If you don't use a computer, please call Donna at the parish office at 301-261-7399 extension 35 to get help to do this change. Please know that you can end or change your Faith Direct giving at any time without any delays or waiting.

Second of all, we know that many people have been affected economically by Covid-19 and the quarantine, etc. If you are one of those people we don't want to worry you with any request for funds at this time.

But, if you are able to marginally increase your giving – maybe consider doing so at this time. For while we try to be as frugal as possible here at the parish, costs do continue to rise each year for us in running the parish.

In the end, I do believe in the important work of a local parish. I believe that what we do here at Holy Family has an impact on many people, so I ask you all of this sincerely simply as a brother in Christ who is trying to move our parish forward to continue to do the work that has been given us to do.

PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**



STEWARDSHIP: Offertory donations are essential for Holy Family's parish operations. We rely heavily on the Sunday offertory to maintain operational budgets, and fund staff positions and outreach activities in our community. Many of you have asked how to continue your support while you are unable to attend Mass in person. Holy Family uses Faith Direct to facilitate electronic giving directly to the parish accounts. If you are not already enrolled in Faith Direct you can use this link <https://membership.faithdirect.net/MD61> or use the link on the Holy Family website. You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. You may also mail your offertory envelopes to the Church office at Holy Family, PO Box 130, Davidsonville, MD 21035. STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY: Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. ENVIROMENTAL MINISTRY: *Did You Know* a single Bat can eat up to 1,000 Mosquitoes in just an hour? They will feed all nigh long. We talked earlier about dragonflies eating mosquitoes during the day and the importance of native plant habitats. Our bats can use a little extra help. Bat houses are available at hardware stores and online. The rectangular boxes, typically made of wood, have an open bottom and an envelope-like opening at the top. The inside has chambers or cells for bats to hang out and the boxes are mounted on poles or trees. More than once I have assured Mary Ann they will not fly into her hair. After many decades they never have.

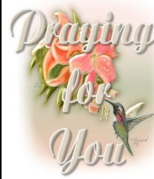

The Catechism of the Catholic Church clearly states: "the spouses as ministers of God's grace confer upon each other the sacrament of Matrimony by expressing their consent before the Church." The priest or deacon receives (but does not minister) the consent and gives the blessing in the name of the Church.

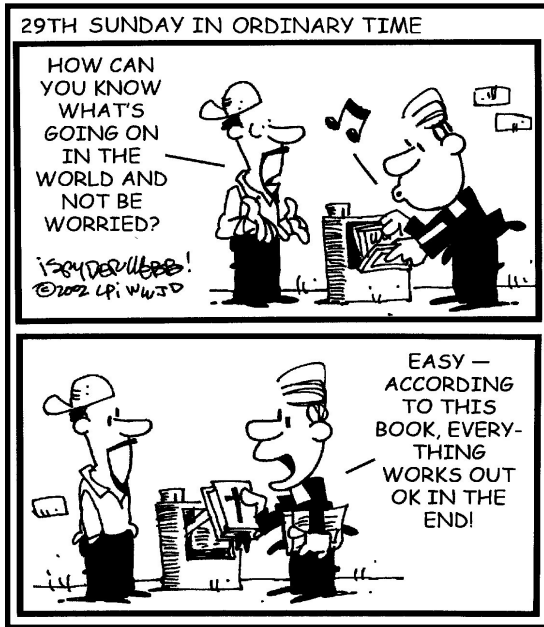
