CARING FOR CREATION: Did you know that leaves blown into the storm drain flow into our rivers and ultimately into the Chesapeake Bay? Leaves require 200% more oxygen to break down in water, than on land robbing our fish, shrimp and crabs the oxygen they need to survive this winter. Pick up those leaves on your hard surfaces and compost them or bag them for the county to

make "Compro" which you can buy next Spring for your garden. Mowing them up into a pile of small pieces reduces the number of bags you need and more importantly helps them break down in your compost bin more quickly. Chopped leaves are great for your garden beds and will provide winter cover protecting your perennials and shrubs. You too can be a good neighbor and friend of the Bay's wildlife. Remember to check the air pressure in your car's tires. As the air cools in the Fall the air pressure in your tires can fall as much as 10 lbs making it dangerous and difficult to control in an emergency situation. Look in the drivers door jam or glove box for the correct setting, not what is on the side of the tire. Do you have any ideas you would like to share and more importantly help get them done? Answer to last week's question about the Advent wreath: The wreath as a circle -God's love is eternal. Green from evergreens - symbol of everlasting life.

Candles - light in anticipation of Christ coming as the "Light of the World." Candles are purple except the third (rose). They are symbols of: Hope, prophecy and expectation of what is to come. Love, sometimes called the Bethlehem Candle. Joy, this rose candle is often called Mary's Candle. Peace, often called the Angel's Candle.
