HOLY FAMILY

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Easter to everyone! This, indeed, is a day to celebrate! We recall that blessed event which dramatically altered, not only our Lord Jesus Christ Himself, but also the lives of those first disciples. They were transformed from a fearful group of men and women who were hiding from the Romans. Even Peter, **“the rock,”** stumbled and denied he knew Jesus three times during the time of Jesus’ arrest to a group who all gave their lives (among the 11 besides Judas Iscariot) except for one (John) preaching that Jesus had risen from the dead. As we look upon these events it might occur to us that no one would put themselves into danger of torture and death for someone who was a liar or for someone who was crazy. But, they had all experienced something amazing, which had caused them to preach that Jesus was God, the Son of God.

SO, on this day we are inheritors of that blessed teaching, as Christians.

In my own life as a priest, I wish sometimes that people in the world who wonder about this beautiful truth might just see what I see so that it would bolster their faith. Day in and day out in the parish, I hear people’s stories, regularly, which uplift my faith. It is my conviction that one reason we might get involved at Church and to be a part of the Church community is that, indeed, when we gather together, pray and serve, spend time with other believers, that strengthens our faith, and we then hear those stories that lift up our faith and confirm that suspicion we had all along. There **IS** something bigger than ourselves out there (**God**), that despite the travails of this world, that there is a God who loves us....and that Jesus is God and our Savior.

In 1988, the year I had my call to the priesthood, there was a music group, **“The Godfathers,”** who released a song called **“Birth, School, Work, Death”** which was a sort of sad ode sung about someone just getting through all the stages of life without too much hope. One line went: And I don’t know where to go this time it’s gonna be forever. I’ll live and die don’t ask me why. I want to go to paradise, it’s only **BIRTH, SCHOOL, WORK, DEATH.**

Well, this Easter we recall that life is much more than **BIRTH, SCHOOL, WORK AND DEATH**....but that our names are inscribed in heaven, and that we are **“fearfully, wonderfully made” (Psalm 139)** and that we are loved enough that God, indeed, died for us.

Now, that doesn’t fix everything in our lives now does it? But it is good, as we go through this life, to know that we are important and loved. Loved enough that God the Creator would die for us. Let’s remember that today. Let’s get involved in Church where we can have our faith strengthened by other people like us. People who know that it’s **NOT** just **“BIRTH, SCHOOL, WORK and DEATH.”** There is a love which surpasses all understanding, who has overcome sin and death. In Jesus’ name.

Join us for our **DIVINE MERCY** celebration on Sunday, April 28th at 2pm in the Church. We will pray the chaplet, go to confession, hear music and scripture and readings from St. Faustina’s Diary.

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD CYCLE



DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: **Question:** In the Gospels, how many times does Jesus appear after His resurrection?

Answer to last week's question: The four men and one woman to be baptized will receive the Oil of Catechumens. The three men and three women being received into the Church, along with the newly baptized, will be blessed with Sacred Chrism, a mixture of blessed olive oil and balsam. Chrism is the most important oil used in Catholic rites. In the Old Testament, a person called to a special task from God (like King David) was anointed with Chrism. It is used for Confirmation and ordinations. **Oils are blessed every year at the Chrism Mass celebrated on the Monday before Easter. During the year the oils are kept in a prominent place in the Church. At Holy Family, they are kept in the case next to the Mary statue.**

THE ENVIRONMENTAL MINISTREE: *Did you know* I cannot wait to cut the grass? The two compost bins are full of shredded leaves from last Fall, yet they have not decomposed very much over the Winter. Why you might ask? There are two main requirements, carbon (leaves) and nitrogen (grass) for a successful compost bin. Cutting the grass for the first few times, the clippings will be mixed with the leaves. This will jumpstart the decomposition. There will be plenty of material to spread over the garden beds. After that, all the clippings will be left on the grass to decompose right in place to enrich the soil.

As a reminder, **The Outdoor Stations of the Cross** are at the rear of the Church. There are booklets there to help guide you in prayer 24/7. The rear parking area is now well lit with brand new low energy LED lights
