HOLY FAMILY

Dear Friends,

This weekend we have the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the 5pm and the 11am Masses. This sacrament is generally for all children old enough to receive First Communion and older. It is also for anyone who has a spiritual, physical or psychological issue and for anyone who is advanced in age.

The sacrament traces its origins back to the Bible, where in James 5 we hear the Scripture say that "***If there are any sick among you, send for the priests.***" Original Greek said "***presyters***" and that meant the local leaders of the Eucharistic communities and they will pray for the sick persons and anoint them with oil.

One interesting point of James 5 was also that the person's **SINS** would also be forgiven through those prayers from the priest at that time, which meant that even the very earliest of Christians already saw the Church as a vehicle for both God's healing and forgiveness.

A couple of things starting up this New Year:

- ♦ I would like to share my invitation to **YOU ALL** to spread the blessing of faith with someone who has been away from Church for a while, to come to The **WELCOME BACK PROGRAM** in the parish library. There are a dozen or dozens of reasons people edge away from going to Church or being involved and there are just as many reasons people suddenly feel like coming back to Church. You might be the very person to spark a new interest. So, please invite at least one person to this program. The gatherings are on the following Thursdays: **January 18th, 25th and February 1st at 7:30pm**. The sessions are in the library and the final session is in the Chapel. Interested? - ♦ Finally, please mark your calendars for our **LENTEN STUDY PROGRAM**. It will start on January 17th and continues through March 21st. **The study will be on "Oremus." IT ENDS THE WEEK BEFORE HOLY WEEK.** We will offer it both in the morning from 10am to 11:30am and in the evening 7pm to 8:30pm. Oremus is a guide to Catholic Prayer teaching you the essentials of an effective and fruitful prayer life. Over the course of eight weeks you will discover how to place yourself in the presence of God. By following the wisdom of the saints and the Tradition of the Church, you will learn how to express yourself to God in prayer, and how to make prayer an integral part of your daily life. Oremus includes eight video presentations by Fr. Mark Toups, lively small-group discussions, and inspiring readings and reflections for each day.

CARING FOR CREATION MINISTREE: Did you know that Oriental Bittersweet kills trees. It is a Deciduous vine that grows up to 66 ft. long. Vines climb by winding around a tree or other support structure. American bittersweet flowers and fruits are only found at the terminal ends of stems, Oriental bittersweet flowers and fruits are found all along the stem at leaf axils. Highly invasive in forests in the Eastern US. Vines girdle trees as they climb to dominate the canopy and shade the understory, reducing and preventing the growth of other plant species. This attractive vine has been used in holiday decorations, and other crafting items, for years because of the beautiful fruiting branches which have red berries and yellow fruit capsules spread along the stem. However, these same persistent berries that make wreaths delightfully charming easily spread the seed of this terrible invasive. Bittersweet will eventually block the sun from the canopy and can topple an already weakened tree. The best thing to do now is cut the vines at the base of the tree and paint with a herbicide. **You can save the tree.**
