

Pastor's Note







Deacon Doug's Q&A

QUESTION: We are in Ordinary Time in the Church calendar. What is meant by "Ordinary Time?"

Answer to what is a scapular? A Scapular is a sacramental that gives the wearer God's protection through the intercession of the church and its saints. It typically consists of two small (usually rectangular) pieces of cloth, wood or laminated paper, a few inches in size, which may bear religious images, often of the Blessed Mother, or text, and are worn one in front on the chest and the other on the back. The Catholic Encyclopedia lists 18 small scapulars for different saints and devotions approved by the Roman Catholic church.
