

Pastor's Note

Some 300 Bingo players gathered for an enjoyable evening of Basket Bingo on Friday, Feb. 2nd in Unity Hall. I thank the parishioners and ministries who donated the beautiful gift baskets as prizes. I also thank our staff members, Margaret Wood and Beth Supple who co-chaired the bingo night, Joni MacDonald for her invaluable help; Bill MacDonald for being the Bingo caller; Tom and Cindy Daily for running the kitchen; our Confirmation candidates and all the volunteers who worked at the bingo. The final profit from the evening has not yet been totaled but the monies raised will go towards paying for our new HVAC System.

On Saturday, Feb. 3rd, our Holy Family "Holy Dippers" Team participated for the second year in the Maryland State Police Polar Plunge at Sandy Point State Park. The Polar Plunge raises funds to support over 15,000 athletes and teammates who participate in the Maryland Special Olympics. I can report to you that it was warmer this year than in 2023! I thank all the parishioners and friends who made contributions to support our Holy Dippers Team.

I also thank the members of our various parish ministries for staffing the meals and providing the breads. All the monies raised will be shared equally among our two sister parishes, St. Gregory the Great in Baltimore and St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Perodin, Haiti and the Food Pantry at Our Lady of Perpetual Help. After sharing the Lenten meal, I invite you to join in praying the Stations of the Cross at 7:30pm in our Church.

Often as we approach the beginning of Lent, we give thought to the spiritual practices which we want to undertake during this holy season. 


