One of the many challenges which many incarcerated prisoners face, beyond their legal situation, is that they may have not graduated from High School. Shirley Theimer, a Holy Family parishioner, has been working with others for several years now providing educational instruction for inmates being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center here in Anne Arundel County, helping them to work towards getting their GED certificate.

Shirley is seeking to get additional volunteers, especially persons to tutor in the areas of Language Arts and Social Studies. Teaching experience is not a requirement. For more information about this program, you can contact her at 410-573-0833. Thank you for your consideration of helping in this program.

Recently, we received photographs of the school children attending the Parish School at our Sister Parish of St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Perodin, Haiti (there are no Public Schools). I am hoping to have these photos posted on our parish website so that we can see pictures of the children during a typical school day. In the meantime, you can see the pictures in the white binder on the Welcome Desk in the Narthex.

By the time you read this, I will have hopefully attended a Haiti Committee meeting about the building of a new rectory at St. Elizabeth. As you may recall, the old rectory was destroyed as a result of an earthquake. Next week, I hope to share with you in the bulletin an update on the rectory project.

Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. The schedule of services and Masses can be found in this bulletin (pgs. 2 & 3) and also on the homepage of our website. I invite you to join us on Friday evenings during Lent for a Simple Meal of Soup and Bread (macaroni and cheese will be available for our younger members) beginning at 6:30pm in Unity Hall. After our Lenten Supper, I invite you to join us for The Stations of the Cross in our Church at 7:30pm.

This Tuesday, February 21st is Shrove Tuesday. Please join us for the Pancake Supper in Unity Hall starting at 5pm (find more details on pg. 6 of this bulletin).

Our Parish theme for this Lent is "Believe in the Gospel." The spiritual challenge for all of us is, "What does it mean on a practical level for each of us, for all of us as a Parish Community, to say, "I/we believe in the Gospel?""

Thank you for your recent gifts of food, including all the soups, which were delivered to the Food Pantry at OLPH.

Lastly, our half day's Men's Retreat is next Saturday, February 25th, beginning with Mass at 9am in our Church and concluding promptly at 12:30pm. After Mass, there will be breakfast and following that, there will be two guest speakers sharing their insight for Catholic men following the Lord Jesus in our world today.
