1. Well, we have entered into the season of Lent! The word "**Lent**" comes from the Old English word that meant "**the spring season**" long ago. Interestingly, in Dutch, which is related to English, their word for "**spring season**" is still "**lente**" as it was over 1000 years ago.

2. Indeed, one thing about Lent is that it does nicely correspond with the transition from Winter to Spring in our natural world, which can help us to better experience the "**new life**" we are celebrating at Easter (for all of Lent is to prepare us for Easter).

3. One parish, years ago, to highlight this relationship between the natural world coming back to life along with **OUR** having new hope and life in our lives because of God in Jesus Christ, the parishioners decorated the area around the altar in the Church with vases filled with forsythia branches, which, initially, were bare. As the weeks went by naturally began to bud and then bloom yellow in the Church.

4. I always thought that that was a symbol of what God wanted for all of us. That we come to life during Lent and find new **HOPE** and **NEW WAYS TO GROW IN THE LOVE OF GOD** during this time.

5. You can do that in Lent through **PRAYER, FASTING AND GIVING ALMS.**



DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: *Question:* The Church has declared this year as the Year of St. Joseph. For whom is St. Joseph the Patron Saint?

Answer to last week's question about beginning of the use of the crucifix: Historians note that the first evidence of public use was in the 5th Century on the door to the Basilica of Santa Sabina in Rome. Until the victory of Constantine in 312 when he adopted the cross he saw as a sign before the battle of Milvin Bridge, the cross had been a sign of scorn among Roman pagans. Before Constantine the crucifix with the corpus of Christ had been used quietly but not publicly among Christians.
