

Can you spend two hours with me and "Spring Into Action" together on Saturday, March 2nd at 9am? If you haven't already enjoyed the meditation trail on the old Post Office property, this might be a chance to see all the great Scout work that was done recently. What are we going to do? We are going to save the lives of a

few trees and a small piece of forest that is part of our beloved Church.

English ivy is one of the top killers of our native trees. Over time hundreds if not thousands of pounds of weight is added to the crown of trees eventually toppling them long before their expected lifespan. Across the ground, English Ivy crowds out any native ground cover from thriving which provides habitat for our native species.

Please join me in this important effort to make Holy Family an important example as a *"faithful steward"* of our land. Bring gloves and clippers and hear more about invasive species. Deacon Doug's Q&A

QUESTION: Holy Communion brought to the sick and those unable to attend Mass in person is contained in a small round metal case that easily fits in the hand. What is it called?

Answer to the question, What is the significance of 40 Days of Lent: 40 is one of the most significant numbers in Scripture. The Hebrews wandered in the desert for 40 years before entering the promised land. Moses spent 40 days with God on Mount Sinai, and of course Jesus spent 40 days in the desert where he was tempted by the devil. "40 days" indicates a spiritual challenge to repent and come closer to God, hence 40 days of Lent.
