#### Pastor's Note

I share with you an update on our Parish's participation in this year's Annual Appeal for Catholic Ministries. As of February 27th, 83 parishioners/families have donated \$54,260 toward our goal of \$119,000. I thank the parishioners who have made a gift to the Annual Appeal which supports over 100 ministries within our Archdiocese and countless persons. If you have been planning to make a gift and need an envelope, there are envelopes with pledge cards on the tables in the narthex.

Our parish will again this year receive a rebate from the Annual Appeal. Our rebate will be divided between our sister parishes of St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Perodin, Haiti, and St. Gregory the Great Parish in Baltimore and our HVAC Campaign.

I extend an invitation to the women of our parish to participate in a retreat day here at Holy Family next Saturday, March 9th beginning with Mass at 9am in our church. Following Mass there will be breakfast. Our speaker, Dr. Barbara Nicolosi, PhD, author, will speak on the timely subject of the media and our Catholic faith. There will be time to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the formal retreat will close at 12 Noon.

Our Parish Mission is coming up and will begin on Sunday, March 10th thru Tuesday, March 12th. Sunday will begin at 6pm-6:45pm with a Pot-luck dinner in Unity Hall. At 7pm that evening, Haley Scott DeMaria, a collegiate swimmer who incurred a life altering accident, will share with us how her faith in Jesus Christ grew stronger as a result of her injury. The Mission will continue on Monday, March 11th and we will conclude our Mission on Tuesday evening, March 12th, with Adoration and an opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I invite you to mark your calendar and join us each night for our Lenten Parish Mission!

# Deacon Doug's Q&A

**QUESTION:** What is the difference between a Church Council (e.g., Vatican II) and a Synod (e.g., the current Synod on Synodality)?

Answer the question what is the small round container used to bring Holy Communion to the sick called: A pyx or pix (Latin: pyxis, transliteration of Greek:  $\pi \upsilon \xi (\varsigma, boxwood receptacle, from \pi \upsilon \xi o\varsigma, box tree)$  is a small round container used in the Catholic Church to carry the consecrated host (Eucharist), to the sick or those who are otherwise unable to come to a church in order to receive Holy Communion.
