

#### Pastor's Note

Are you facing challenges in your life right now? Do you want to have your faith strengthened? If you answered yes to either one of these questions, then please join us for our Parish Mission with Haley Scott DeMaria beginning this Sunday, March 10th. Haley was a collegiate swimmer returning from a swimming meet when a tragic bus accident left two of her teammates dead and left her with a broken back and a prognosis of paralysis. On Sunday and Monday nights she will share with us the story of her recovery and how her catholic faith in Jesus Christ grew stronger as a result of her injury.

On this Sunday and Monday nights join us for a Pot-luck Dinner starting at 6pm in Unity Hall followed by DeMaria's presentation in the church.

The Mission will conclude on Tuesday evening, March 12th, from 7pm-9:30pm with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and an opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There will be several priests present to celebrate the sacrament. See you at the Mission!

Palm Sunday and Easter are approaching quickly. Last year parishioners signed up to serve as greeters at the masses for those two Sundays. 

If you haven't enjoyed the meditation trail in the old Post Office property, this might be a chance to see all the great Scout work that has been done recently. What are we going to do? We are going to save the lives of many trees and revive a small piece of forest that is part of our beloved church. Mother Earth blessed us with lots of rain last weekend. So, we will try again next week on Saturday, March 16th at 9am.

English ivy is one of the top killers of our native trees. Over time many hundreds of pounds of weight is added to the crown of trees eventually toppling them long before their expected lifespan. Across the ground, English Ivy crowds out any native ground cover from thriving which provides habitat for our native species. Please join me in this important effort to make Holy Family an important example as a "faithful steward" of our land. Bring

**QUESTION:** Can we receive communion more than once a day?

Answer to the question about Council and Synod: According to the <u>Catholic Encyclopedia</u>, "Councils are legally convened assemblies of ecclesiastical dignitaries and theological experts for the purpose of discussing and regulating matters of church doctrine and discipline." Vatican II convened in the 1960's is the most recent Council. Synods traditionally have been gatherings of bishops focused on local (diocesan or regional) matters. The present Synod on Synodality is a gathering of input from around the world and all members of the church for the purpose of advising the Pope.
