

Pastor's Note

As Lent draws to a close on this Wednesday and we enter the Sacred Triduum, I thank members of the various ministries (The Book Club, The Secular Franciscans, Holy Hour and Grace Within, St. Vincent de Paul Society, The Knights of Columbus and Disciples in Christ Discussion Group) who picked up the soups, provided the breads, served and cleaned up at our Friday night Lenten Soup and Bread suppers held in Unity Hall. I also thank Yellow Fin Restaurant for providing two soups free of charge each week of the suppers.

The monies raised from all the suppers will be distributed equally among our sister parishes of St. Gregory the Great in Baltimore; St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Perodin, Haiti; and the Food Pantry at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Edgewater.

This Monday night, March 25th, the Chrism Mass will be celebrated by Archbishop Lori at The Cathedral of Mary Our Queen in Baltimore. During that Mass the Archbishop and the priests gathered will renew our ordination promises. Following that renewal of promises, Archbishop Lori will bless the new oils - the Oil of the Catechumens and the Oil of the Sick. Then he will consecrate the Oil of the Chrism, a sweet smelling oil, with which on the day all those ordained a bishop or priest, who are baptized or who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, will be anointed.

Please pray for the eight adults who will receive the Easter Sacraments of baptism, confirmation and eucharist at the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday Night.

As we enter Holy Week, the holiest week of the church year, I invite you to join us for the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, Mar. 28 at 7:30pm followed by the Procession to the Chapel of Reservation in Unity Hall, and The Passion of the Lord on Good Friday, Mar. 29 at 2pm.

During the week, I invite you to stop by our 1929 Chapel to pray before the Blessed Sacrament.

If you are going to join us for Easter here at Holy Family, please warmly welcome with a smile and kind words in church and out on the parking lot all who will be visiting and praying with us this Easter. This is our opportunity to exemplify our parish as welcoming and friendly parish! If you will be traveling for Easter, I pray that you will have safe travels and I look forward to greeting you in the Easter season.

Why did the people throw palms before Jesus' Triumphal entry into Jerusalem? In Christianity, the palm branch is associated with Jesus when the Gospel of John says of the citizens, they took palm branches and went out to meet Him and cried out *"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord"* (chapter 12 v 12:13).

The **palm branch** or **palm frond**, is a symbol of victory, triumph, peace, and eternal life originating in the ancient Near East and Mediterranean world. In Judaism, the lulav, a closed frond of the date palm is part of the festival of Sukkot. A palm branch was awarded to victorious athletes and a palm frond is one of the most common attributes of victory in Ancient Rome.

QUESTION: What is the Paschal Candle; why is it important?

Answer to the question about the oils blessed at the Chrism Mass the Monday before Easter: Oil of Catechumens – for anointing before Baptism; Oil of the Sick – for healing and the last rites (before dying); and Chrism used at ordinations for anointing bishops, priests and deacons and at Baptism for ALL Catholics.



Anointing of the Sick: If you or someone you know would like to receive this sacrament please contact the office, or if appropriate, the hospital chaplain.


