Don't know what else I could've done differently, that would have made a difference. I carefully placed her in the underbrush away from the side of the road. There she will make a meal for the rest of the animals of the forest. The cycle of life continues. I know that intellectually, yet I am still sad.

Now I realize it was an honor to be able to hold her, to feel her still warm body and carry her to a safe place and give her back to the forest. Amen.

Answer to the question about the significance of the color purple in the Church: Purple, with its deep and almost

night-like shade, symbolizes repentance, penance, abstinence and fasting which are closely associated with Lent. Purple was used as an act of derision toward Our Lord when Pilate placed a purple robe on Jesus, whom he called "King of the Jews." Purple thus symbolizes pain, suffering, mourning and penitence.


