~ *Pastor's Note* ~

Two weeks ago I shared with you in an insert in the bulletin that the 1940's rectory at St. Elizabeth of Hungary, our Sister Parish in Perodin, Haiti was destroyed by an earthquake in January of this year. Since the time of the earthquake, Fr. Gilfrid, the pastor, and the parish deacon have been sleeping in a classroom in one of the school buildings which fortunately suffered no structural damage from the earthquake since it was built more recently to withstand earthquakes.

Before the January earthquake, the rectory which was built some 70 years ago, was already showing cracks in its walls from earlier earthquakes. Seeing major cracks in the rectory walls, Fr. Gilfrid began working with an architect to draw up plans for the construction of a new rectory, which also serves as a parish office and meeting space for parishioners.

The cost of the new construction of the rectory is \$128,000. Along with our parish, our neighboring parishes of Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Our Lady of Sorrows are also each a sister parish with St. Elizabeth Parish. Collaborating with our two neighboring parishes, Fr. Rich Gray, their Pastor, and I believe that our three parishes collaborating together can raise the funds to build the new rectory. If a total of 256 families from our three South County Parishes give a \$500 donation, we can raise the monies in less than a year. For example, one could choose to give \$50 a month.

I invite you to join me in building the new rectory at our Sister Parish. If you are contributing with a check, please make it payable to Holy Family and write in the memo line "**Haiti Rectory.**" You can place your gift in the basket marked "**Haiti Rectory Donation**" which is on the table in front of the cross in the Narthex. If you have any questions, please contact me. In advance, I thank you for your support of this project which will bring hope to Fr. Gilfrid and the parishioners of our sister parish of St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

CARING FOR CREATION: So every year chickweed appears in the landscape this time of year beginning as small clusters of green petals with small white flowers. It's Latin name, *Stellaria media*, is an annual and perennial flowering plant. It is native to Eurasia and naturalized throughout the world. This species is used as a cooling

herbal remedy, and grown as a vegetable crop and ground cover for both human and poultry consumption. Nice huh? To me, it's a weed, not native to North America. We will never get rid of it. Why should we try, you might ask? Nothing personal but its behavior, that's the challenge. As the season moves on it will expand to ever larger and larger patches. Smothering everything in its path. This fall when it's cold it'll die off leaving bare patches of soil which soil will run off, adding silt to our waterways. Cloudy water prevents underwater grasses from growing and creating habitat for crabs in our bay. So, I'll keep digging it up from the flower beds and lawn and trying to make a small difference in my own small way.

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: After Mass our parish has begun to say the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel. What is the prayer and why do we say it?

Answer to the question about the origin of the Stations of the Cross: Earliest records show that in the 13th Century the Franciscans began the devotion of physically following the steps of Jesus in Jerusalem when they were allowed back into the Holy Land. The practice expanded in Europe in many different forms under the direction of the Franciscans. By 1862 the Pope allowed the stations to be placed inside all churches without Franciscan supervision. Pope John Paul II on Good Friday 1991 introduced the Scriptural Way of the Cross in which all fourteen stations are based on Scripture.

THE ABORTION AMENDMENT IS NOT YET A REALITY AND WE CANNOT LET IT BECOME ONE! Sadly, the Maryland House of Delegates voted to accept two bills that expand abortion access and force Maryland taxpayers to pay for all abortions by large margins (93-42 and 89-47 respectively). The bills are:

- ◆ **HB1171 Declaration of Rights - Right to Reproductive Liberty** - Women in Maryland already have reproductive freedom. What is new is that making abortion a "fundamental right" in Maryland's constitution will: remove all restrictions on abortion.
- ◆ **HB0937/SB0890 Abortion Care Access Act** commits public funding (\$3.5 million) for abortion training and eliminates the requirement that abortions are performed under the supervision of a licensed medical physician.
- ◆ **BE A VOICE FOR THE VOICELESS** by visiting MDRTL.ORG and selecting the **Take Action** Button. The site provides your representatives contact info along with scripts you can use if you would like.
