

HOLY FAMILY

*Dear Brothers and Sisters,
Gospel Meditation-Encourage Deeper Understanding
Of Scripture
4th Sunday of Lent/March 30th & 31st*

Repentance. Envy. Joy. Hope. Have you felt these human emotions? Today's Gospel offers a rich story, one we can all find our place in. As we reflect on our own spiritual lives this Lenten season, it can be helpful to imagine ourselves in the story of the Prodigal Son.

"I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers." The younger son has sinned greatly, betraying his father's trust and squandering his money in sin. Yet the parable turns on his deep repentance and humble return to his father. Is there any area of your life you have been wandering from God or you've squandered good gifts? This Lent, return to the sacrament of Confession! God, a merciful Father, waits for you there.

"While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him." The father in the parable sees his son's selfishness, perhaps even suspects what he might do, but gives him the inheritance anyway. After his son's departure, the father waits with hope for his son's eventual return. Has someone you love left the Church, made poor decisions, or abused your trust? This Lent is a time to let go of bitterness and to live in hope. Prepare your heart to be merciful!

Not all in the parable invite the mercy of God into their hearts. The self-righteous older brother dishonors his father with his pettiness. "My son, you are here with me always, everything I have is yours." Do you covet what others have? Do you feel as if you've been taken advantage of or that your work goes unseen? This Lent is a time to grow in gratitude. Take a close look at the blessings in our life that you might be missing.

We are all called to repentance. Open your heart to God's personal invitation to growth!

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: *Question:* This year Easter Sunday falls on April 21st. Is this the latest date for Easter? How is the date for Easter determined?

Answer to last week's question: The scrutinies are a key part of RCIA. At the beginning of Lent, catechumens are “elected” by the bishop for the Easter sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. As they begin their final period of “purification” and enlightenment, the elect undergo scrutinies on the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent. Public scrutiny helps to remind the Elect first that they are sinners (**as we all are**) but that is not a cause for discouragement; second, they include a prayer for freedom and protection from the effects of sin and influence of the devil; to heal what is sinful and strengthen what is good. The Elect need our prayers as this final season of preparation can be a time of fatigue and temptation. The scrutinies, then, are a way for us, the Church, to help support them on this final leg of their journey to Easter. The Elect are only those who will be baptized. Those already baptized but being received into the Church are Candidates and like us are already among the Elect.



If you are going to throw them away gather them in one bag and tie a knot to prevent them from blowing away from the truck or at the land fill. Better yet, bring your reusable bags to the store or request paper bags, a renewable resource.



You will be seeing lots of flowers soon in the stores. Guess what, the tender plants are on carts with wheels and are brought inside when it gets close to freezing. Unless you want to do that too, wait until May 1st when the chance of frost has passed. Pansies excluded, they are hardy, but will fade in the summer heat. Please read labels and try plants native to Maryland. Our local Nurseries will have them. Big box and grocery stores not so much. Get out your phone and look up the plant. Some plants sold in the stores are quite invasive, "**some**" will have red warning tags. Oh please, no Bradford Pears or English Ivy.




