



Caring For Creation: Chris Gordon

May the blessings of Easter be upon you and your family. A sure sign of Easter for me outside is the arrival of the mayapples. Anymore, they appear here in March. Did you know they grow in colonies in areas of many hundreds of square feet? What we see is essentially one large plant interconnected by rhizomes all over the forest floor. The namesake apples will appear later in the season. In the photograph we see here, the plant expresses itself as it comes up through the leaf litter. All of this is a habitat for insects and small animals to over winter and thus providing food for the many birds in our Nature scape. While this plant is used for medicinal purposes by some, it is generally considered toxic and not to be eaten. Welcome spring, welcome daylight. Christ has risen!

Deacon Doug's Q&A

QUESTION: The First Readings at Mass after Easter are from the Acts of the Apostles. Why?

Answer to the question what the Pascal Candle is and why is it important: It is the special (very tall) candle lit in the dark at the beginning of the Easter Vigil from a new fire and represents the Light of the Risen Christ. It is lit at every Mass during the 50 days of Easter and after that at all baptisms and funerals.
