~ Pastor's Note ~

Gathering on this Palm Sunday, we begin Holy Week, the holiest in the Christian Year. I invite you to participate in the services of The Sacred Triduum - the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday at 7:30pm in the Church; The Solemn Commemoration of the Lord's Passion and Death on Good Friday at 2pm; and the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday Night beginning at 8pm. The full schedule of Holy Week and other events can be found in this bulletin, in the Friday Blast, and on our website (<u>www.holyfamilychurch.com</u>). This Monday evening, April 3rd of Holy Week, I will join fellow

clergy and Catholics from throughout the Archdiocese for the Chrism Mass celebrated by Archbishop Lori at The Cathedral of Mary Our Queen in Baltimore. At this Mass, the Archbishop will bless the three Oils - the Oil of Catechumens, the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of Sacred Chrism. Candidates for the Sacrament of Baptism are anointed with the Oil of the Catechumens to strengthen them as they prepare to be Baptized. Any person who is seriously ill or who is anticipating a surgery or a medical procedure can ask to be anointed for healing with the Oil of the Sick. When a person is Baptized, Confirmed or Ordained a Priest, the person is anointed with the Oil of Chrism to strengthen them in living out the sacrament which they have received.

Our Parish will formerly receive the Oils at the beginning of the Mass of The Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6th at 7:30pm in the Church. At this Mass we will commemorate Jesus instituting the Gift of the Eucharist. During that Mass, I will follow Jesus' own example and wash the feet of parishioners, reminding me that I am to be your humble servant. At the end of the Mass we will have the Solemn Procession of the Eucharist from our Church to the Altar of Repose in Unity Hall.

On Good Friday, starting at 2pm we will have the Service of the Lord's Passion, commemorating Jesus' dying on the cross for us. On Holy Saturday night we will begin the Easter Vigil at 8pm

with the Blessing of the Easter fire and the lighting of a new Pascal Candle. At the Vigil Mass, the Elect, those persons who have journeyed in Faith since last Fall, will be Baptized, Confirmed and receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist for the first time.

On Holy Saturday morning at 10am, we will have our annual Easter Egg Hunt for the children of our parish in the back parking lot. We will then have the Blessing of Easter food and drinks at 11am in the Church.

If you are traveling this Easter to visit with family and friends, I pray that you will have safe journeys and I look forward to seeing you when you return home to our Parish. May God Bless you throughout this Holy Week!

All Churches look to the Christmas and Easter offertory collections to provide funds to support the mission of the Parish. Our Parish Mission Statement is "Engaged in Christ, Engaged with Each Other, Engaged in our Community." In this second year serving as your Pastor, I thank you for your financial support and this Easter I ask for your generous support of our Parish.

I would encourage all of us this Easter to welcome with a smile and hospitality those who will be gathering with us. In light of these past years of the pandemic, I believe people are longing for an experience of fraternal community. Guided by the Holy Spirit, let's extend a warm welcome to one another always but especially during this coming Holy Week and Easter here at Holy Family.

As I have mentioned earlier, we have several members who are completing their 5 years serving on the Council and will be rotating off in June, 2023. Subsequently, we are seeking several new members. If you would like to serve on our Pastoral Council, please send me your biography and why you would like to serve on the council. We also need a recording secretary for the council meetings. If you are willing to serve as the recorder at our monthly meetings, please contact me.

Lastly, the eleven members of our Parish's Strategic Planning Committee continue to meet. The strategic planning formation will take some 12 more months to complete. As I have explained in earlier bulletins, the purpose of the committee is to examine all aspects of our parish's life such as worship; prayer; evangelization; faith formation for all ages; youth ministry; service and witness; facilities and parking; communication and community relations. At our last meeting, the committee members were asked to go out into their communities and observe their various surroundings. This can be referred to as "Neighborhood Reading." I ask for your prayers as we continue this process and begin to dream and envision what we would like our parish to become making us more vibrant as Disciples of Christ in the years to come.

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Who was the first person to see Jesus after he rose from the dead?

Answer to the question : What is the Triduum and sacraments associated with it. Triduum means three and it is the term the Church for centuries has used for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery: Christ's passion, death and resurrection. The Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, includes the Passion on Good Friday, the Easter Vigil on Saturday night and ends after evening prayers at sunset on Easter Day. Sacraments celebrated include Eucharist (Holy Thursday), and for those welcomed into Church at the Vigil, Baptism and Confirmation, as well as First Eucharist.

• It is the first Sunday after Easter, and it is the last day of the Easter Octave.


• Observance of the requirements for Divine Mercy Sunday can mean total expiation of all sins and punishments plus the immediate entry into Heaven following death.
