

I share with you an update on our parish's participation in the 2024 Annual Appeal for Catholic Ministries. As of April 8th, 183 Holy Family parishioners/families have donated \$104,765 to the Appeal! Thank you for your faithful and generous support to the 2024 Appeal. Our parish's rebate which we will receive from the Appeal will be designated for our HVAC Campaign and will also be shared with our two sister parishes, St. Elizabeth of Hungry in Perodin, Haiti and St. Gregory the Great in Baltimore.

Little Bethlehem offers for sale beautiful, hand carved religious articles from the Holy Land. 



Caring For Creation: Chris Gordon

For more than 20 years, we have been hearing stories of the Honeybee colony collapse. In the latest survey, we've added nearly 1,000,000 colonies in the last five years. Native to Europe and brought to this country, Honeybees colonies are used by farmers to pollinate their crops. Almonds, followed by blueberries, apples, cherries, and cranberries, are some of the main crops pollinated by honeybees. Nearly half of those colonies will not survive till the spring. So maybe we've turned a corner. I'll take good news where it can be found.

So, what can you do? Be careful about using pesticides, particularly mosquito sprays. Plant more flowers to provide a food source all season.

Deacon Doug's Q&A

QUESTION: In only two gospels does Jesus appear to the disciples in Jerusalem. Which two are they?

Answer to the question why do we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday: Divine Mercy Sunday is a day of prayer when we ask the Lord to renew our trust in His merciful love. It concludes the Octave of Easter and focuses on Christ's gift of mercy for the whole world. St. John Paul II designated it as a Feast Day in April 2000, the day he canonized St. Faustina Kowalska who received a series of revelations in the 1930's from Our Lord who called for a special feast on that Sunday It is not a feast based solely on St. Faustina's revelations, nor primarily about St. Faustina. The Second Sunday of Easter was already a solemnity as the Octave Day of Easter. The title "Divine Mercy Sunday" does, however, highlight the meaning of the day.
