

you CARING FOR CREATION: Did know that Invasive Garlic Mustard is sprouting everywhere? Invasives crowd out our native plants which in-turn feed our native wildlife. It is very distinct with its little white flowers. Take a look at this picture and you can't miss it. Fortunately, for us if there is such a thing, it pulls up easily. We can use a string trimmer, which does knock it down. It takes a couple years to use up the seed bank that's in the soil, but now is the time to try to get it under control.

Alliaria petiolata is a biennial flowering plant in the Mustard family, Brassicaceae. It is native to Europe, western and central Asia, and northwestern Africa, from Morocco, Iberia.

Answer to the question about the rays from Jesus Heart on the Divine Mercy statue: In His answer to Saint Faustina, Jesus told her that "The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water (that flows from His side) and makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross."

OUR DAILY BREAD CASSEROLES


Casserole pans will be available in the Narthex and under the blue grocery cart outside (weather allowing) the weekends of April 15th & 16th and
