

Caring For Creation: Chris Gordon

Fellow parishioner, Judy Hool asked me the other day about plants and attracting butterflies. I suggested getting the Butterfly Milkweed that's a native plant and not getting a Butterfly Bush, which is not native. Monarch butterflies require Butterfly Milkweed in their lifecycle. Be sure to take your phone with you. Any plant that you consider before purchasing, you should look it up and see if it's native. That should always be a consideration, not a requirement. Most nurseries have a Native Plants section so be sure and ask. Our native butterflies evolved to be nurtured by the native plants they encountered over the millennium. Anointing of the Sick: If you or someone you know would like to receive this sacrament please contact the office, or if appropriate, the hospital chaplain.


