

CARING FOR CREATION:
On April 20th, The Environmental Protection Agency has agreed to step up enforcement in Pennsylvania to ensure that it meets targets for reducing pollution in the Chesapeake Bay. State and environmental officials announced that under the

settlement, the federal agency will apply additional pressure on Pennsylvania to reduce agricultural waste and runoff from urban and suburban areas, spilling into the Susquehanna River and other tributaries that feed the bay.

Every year, spring and summer rains cause massive algae blooms up and down the Chesapeake Bay starting from the Susquehanna Dam at the Pennsylvania Border north of Havre de Grace, MD. Fed by agricultural runoff, these algae blooms contribute to fish, kills and oyster die offs. Looking forward to see improvements in our bay in the years to come.


