HOLY FAMILY

*Dear Brothers and Sisters,
May 4th-5th*

We will be crowning a statue of the Virgin Mary at all Masses this weekend, as May is a month when we remember the Virgin Mary. A couple of things to deal with, then, in explaining this practice. First of all: Some non-Catholics might object to having a statue of Mary. They look at Exodus 20:4-6 where the Lord God gives the following commandment to the Israelites, on Mt Sinai, along with all of the 10 commandments. God says, in Exodus 20:4-6:

You will not make any graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: And you will not bow down yourself to them, nor serve them: for I the LORD thy God am a jealous God.

Well, before we go any further, please then also note what is recorded in Exodus 25:18-20, that God instructs these same Israelites, at Mt. Sinai, to make two statues of angels, out of gold, to decorate the tabernacle:

God says:

“(Make) cherubim out of hammered gold at the ends of the cover. Make one cherub on one end and the second cherub on the other; make the cherubim of one piece with the cover, at the two ends. The cherubim are to have their wings spread upward, overshadowing the cover with them.

So, yes in Ex 20 God says don't make images, but in Ex 25 God is **TELLING** the Israelites to make images, so what is going on?

Well, the key, it would follow, is that in Ex 20 God is telling the people not to bow down to or to serve (**or worship**) any statue or image (**as they did when they worshipped a statue of a golden calf in Exodus 32**). God doesn't seem, it would follow, to have a categorical problem with statues if he asks the Israelites to use statues as religious art in Ex 25.

So, our statue of Mary is just meant to remind us of the good example of the Virgin Mary who said **YES** to God....and of her courage and faithfulness.

So, the **SECOND** point we are making to explain this practice of honoring the Virgin Mary by crowning her statue the first weekend of May, while we know Jesus is our Lord and Savior, we also honor Mary because we want her example and prayers to **PUT ASIDE** the false gods or idols of this world and to have her simple faith and sincere FIAT to the Lord.

Indeed, Jesus started the Church to be a community of people who would help to inspire one another along the life of faith: Saints, like the Virgin Mary, are spoken of and honored in the Catholic tradition **BECAUSE** they help us to follow Christ.

May the grace of Jesus and the prayers of the Virgin Mary and St. Joseph be with you this week.


