Dear Brothers and Sisters,

First of all, we have our monthly **"confessions day"** this coming Wednesday, May 9th. I will be hearing confessions in the Church at 8am, 11am and 7pm. Just go to the far-left door at the front of the Church, where you see the purple and white **"Welcome"** sign. That door will be open.

At all the Masses this weekend we will **"crown"** the statue of the Virgin Mary in the Church. We'll invite all the kids to come to the front of the Church for the crowning. There will be a reception after the 11am Mass in the Upper Gallery.

How would you explain this **"crowning"** of a statue of Mary to non-Catholic friends? Well, number one, we honor Mary as an example of what it means to be a disciple. She said **"yes"** to God in her life, by saying yes to being the Mother of our Lord, and because of her humility. We think of Mary because we simply ask for her prayers to better follow Jesus in our lives.

It is part of the Catholic tradition, and the most ancient tradition of Christianity, to ask for the prayers of other Christians, whether they are on earth or in heaven to better follow Jesus. This is not a detraction from a personal relationship with Jesus Himself, but it, instead, rightfully remembers that **HE** started the Church and **WANTED US** to be a people who **DID NOT JUST TURN TO HIM IN A SOLITARY JOURNEY OF FAITH**, but that **WE WOULD BE PART OF A COMMUNITY THAT PRAYED FOR ONE ANOTHER AND SUPPORTED ONE ANOTHER** while following Him.

So, as part of that broader tradition, we turn to Mary, the Mother of our Lord, at times, to simply pray for us while we, again, honor her **"yes"** to God and see it as an example for our own lives.

As for crowning Mary: We crown her because, while she was a simple and humble person, her **"yes"** changed the world....and so by honoring her, we are putting faith in the power of all the simple and humble people in the world to change things for the better....by also saying **"yes"** to God in their lives.


We crown her to honor this simple and humble disciple who said **"YES"** to God and we ask Mary to **PRAY FOR US** in our own journey of faith, as a friend.


