CAN YOU HELP WITH THE ST. GREGORY CHRISTMAS FAMILY ADOPTION PROGRAM? For many years we have had an "adopt a family" Christmas gift program for one of our sister parishes, St. Gregory in Baltimore. This involves Holy Family parishioners taking a family and buying gifts of clothing, toys/etc. for children with specific ages listed.

This project does involve a lot of work on the part of those who run the program. There are approximately 125 families who may have multiple children for which to buy presents, as well as the project of getting those gifts sorted and delivered to Baltimore.

This program has been one that is wonderful and important to both Holy Family and St. Gregory, but we need your help if this project is going to continue. **In fact, we need some organizers who are willing to say they can help to take on this effort in its entirety.** This is because, as our parish has grown, so have the duties of our staff, and while we find, in the day to day work of the parish, that our staffing is sufficient, the timing of this project during the holidays is one where we have decided that, if this program is going to continue, we need some strong volunteers to step forward and take this project on rather than continue to rely on the office staff to run and own this program.

Can you help? To commit to having this program in November/December 2018, we will need to know we have a solid committee of parish volunteers ready to take this project on by **July 1st**. Save the date:

There will be a special **CONSECRATION TO THE VIRGIN MARY** on the Feast of the Visitation (Thursday, May 31st) with rosary at 7pm and a Mass at 7:30pm in the Church. What is this consecration all about? Simply asking for prayers to better follow Jesus...from Jesus's mother. This idea comes out of the larger mindset, from ancient Christianity, that we can ask for the prayers of those who have died: For every Christian martyr under the Roman Empire became revered by those very earliest Christians, some of whom knew the Lord Jesus Himself. They would go to pilgrimage to where they had been martyred, and they kept relics (pieces of clothing, etc.) of the saint on their person to remind them of the prayers coming from heaven. The Letter to the Hebrews 12:1 references the prayers who have died when St. Paul mentioned the "cloud of witnesses" who are all around us and who pray for us.



CARING FOR CREATION MINISTREE:

Did you know there are six states that lie in the Chesapeake Bay “watershed,” Delaware, Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia and the District of Columbia covering 64,000 square miles? There are 100’s of water quality monitoring stations in

our watershed. Nitrogen, phosphorus, and sediment are the pollutants of greatest concern. High levels of these pollutants enter the water from various sources, including agricultural operations, urban runoff, wastewater facilities, septic systems, air pollution, as well as other sources. But, **did you know** that air pollution from the “airshed” which in addition includes Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky, North Carolina and Tennessee covering 350,000 square miles contribute 25% of the nitrogen oxide and heavy metals (think, burning fossil fuels) that are going into the Chesapeake Bay?

Can you bring **one can or box of food** for the poor to Church with you each week? There are green bins on either side of the doors in the Narthex and are collected weekly and delivered to Our Lady of Perpetual Help.
