HOLY FAMILY

Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord. We think about how while Jesus came among us, to become one of us, to walk with us, to be with us in a closer way and even to show us the depths of His love by suffering and dying for us, that He did not stay within our sight permanently.

That makes me think of what was really intended at the Last Supper when Jesus gave us this special sacrament of the Eucharist. Let us consider that it was a gift given to us on the night before He was to be arrested and to suffer and die and while the resurrection was going to follow, that was only going to be for a few short weeks. So when Jesus gives us this gift to say **"I will be with you, really with you"** in the bread and the wine that become His Body and Blood....don't you think that the Last Supper/the Lord's Supper/the Eucharist/the Mass is a powerful continuance of what was begun at the manger in Bethlehem. A town whose name means **"House of Bread."** Just as Jesus came to be **SEEN** among us as a baby in Bethlehem....so the Eucharist is Jesus's gift to tell us that we will still be able to see Him in the breaking of the bread.

Certainly the early Christians took this gift as a literal and real blessing and on this Feast, when we contemplate the day Jesus disappeared from our sight, let us remember that, indeed, He will appear in the form of bread and wine on the altar today.


Please remember the last class of our **"Catholicism 101"** class today, May 28th from 12:15pm-1:15pm in classrooms 10 and 11. We'll look at Catholic Moral Teaching, the History of the Church, Mary and the Saints, Purgatory and Heaven.

Finally, a bit about a **"self-study"** that our parish staff and leadership will be undertaking this spring, summer and fall. Our parish is embarking on the development of a strategic plan that will serve as a guide over the next 3-5 years. The plan will help us remain clearly focused on our goal of evangelization, a term we hear from the Pope, from our Archbishop, our Bishops and all Catholic organizations as we face and challenge the many distractions of the 21st century. How do we personally become missionary disciples and how do we move our parish from maintenance to mission? These are questions you will hear over and over.

Our own parishioners will examine what is our true mission and how do we accomplish that. We will look at where we want to go and who we want to be. We will develop goals and strategies to reach them. Once we have done that, we will revisit our plan regularly to be sure we are doing what we set out to do. Strategic planning is no newcomer to business. Successful businesses have done it for decades. It is beneficial in many ways. One, there are so many good or good-sounding ideas that are brought to our staff and ministry heads every week. But which ones can we take on? Can we financially support the ABC plan, or do we have the resources of volunteers and time to support the XYZ plan?

Members of our Parish Council are heading up this process, but they are the facilitators, not the authors of our plan. You will have the opportunity to serve on committees and subcommittees. If you do not want to work at the committee level, you may choose to participate in other ways.

Keep watching, reading, and listening for updates on the strategic plan development.

APPLY FOR A BOOST SCHOLARSHIP:

Want to send your child to private school but can't afford tuition? Or do you already struggle to pay your child's tuition? Maryland's BOOST Scholarship Program is in its second year and is providing nearly \$6 million in scholarships for the upcoming school year to eligible low-income K-12 students toward tuition at a qualifying nonpublic school of their choice.
