*Dear Brothers and Sisters,
June 16th & 17th*

This weekend is Father's Day, when we remember the importance of our Dads and of guys who are a mentor to someone.

All of us know that it is important to know of the love of parents, and this Father's Day weekend we acknowledge our Fathers; but we also salute, at this time, those men who have been mentors or Father-figures to others.

Indeed, we are giving away holy cards with a prayer to St. Joseph this weekend and St. Joseph is a model for our men in giving direction to our young people – even to young people who are not our actual children. It is so important for our society that men step up to their role to bring their gifts to others as mentors -- as teachers, as coaches, to their own children, to nieces and nephews, neighbors, and at Church. For example, to have men teach in our Religious Ed program is important so that young people see that **"real men"** value faith, and that a truly strong man knows that he is even stronger when he doesn't buy into a **"lone ranger"** vision of manhood or one that tries to find affirmation as a man through a certain iconoclastic **"wildness"** that rejects the Church and embraces drugs, alcohol, promiscuity, aggression, or cynicism.

Many guys (and young ladies) suffer from not feeling the love of their fathers and this plays out in a lot of destructive behaviors in our society today. Sometimes also, cultural heroes in our society, in music, the movies, etc., only reinforce that lone ranger attitude, or the iconoclastic attitude of being so focused on **"doing things our own way"** that we end up isolating ourselves, so that we can't commit to any marriage or faith community or community enough to really walk with anyone.

Someone I knew years ago comes to mind: A then-young fellow who did come to Mass and who came to talk to me at times, but he eventually got away from the support of faith and community. Instead he went in for a lot of tattoos of skulls, etc. that tried to show how strong and cool he was, and a succession of girlfriends with whom he was very promiscuous. What was/is behind this? Deep down, in a big world all fellows want to be strong, and somehow those behaviors seemed to make him feel stronger than going to Mass or talking about God. However, I don't believe those behaviors will serve him in the long run. Instead, he needs to see how men experience real strength in their lives through a life lived walking with our God, focusing on good friends and commitments either in marriage or to a cause (like the priesthood), and through meaningful service.

So, **1.** Let's pray for our men today to be mentors and examples to young people, especially our young men. **2.** Please remember to take a St. Joseph holy card with you after Mass. And **3.** Maybe consider being in a parish men's group: Men's groups will meet through the summer: You are Invited...these groups gather 2x a month so please contact group leaders beforehand to make sure when they are meeting. Scholarships BOOST SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM: Broadening Options and Opportunities for Students Today (BOOST). Want to send your child to private school but can't afford tuition? In 2016, the Maryland legislature expanded educational options for income-eligible students through the passage of the Broadening Options and Opportunities for Students Today (BOOST) Program. 

ENVIRONMENTAL MINISTREE: Did you know that hummingbirds are back? The ruby throated hummingbird is the dominant species in the Eastern Hemisphere. Only the male has the red throat. They feed on nectar and small insects. Feeders are available at hardware, big box stores and online. There is no need to purchase "expensive" nectar because it can be made at home. Take hot water and add a cup of sugar to a quart jar. There is no need to add red dye, the birds are attracted to the yellow flowers on the feeder. Change water every few days or so, particularly when it is hot. Listen to their calls, a deep husky sound. Make sure your screens are secured and doors are shut so they don't come into the house. **Recently, we had a guest but she made it out safely!**




