HOLY FAMILY

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

June 22nd & 23rd

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. On this day we remember the gift of the Holy Eucharist to the Church.

The Mass was given to us by Jesus at the Last Supper....where, the night before Jesus died on the cross, Jesus got the disciples together took bread and wine, prayed over the bread and wine and told the disciples that it was His Body and Blood.

After Jesus ascended into heaven, we see in the book called "**The Acts of the Apostles**," in the Bible, chapter two, that the first Christians celebrated the Mass every single day.

Indeed, the Mass, what Jesus did at the Last Supper, is the **ONE** thing that Jesus asked his friends to do **TOGETHER** when they prayed as a group: **THE ONE THING**, so that we know it was important to Jesus.

One way we know that the first followers of Jesus KNEW that the Mass was important to Jesus is that ALL the ancient Churches that trace their beginnings back to the apostles: The Ethiopian, the Thomas Churches in India, Armenian, Copt, the Orthodox Churches.....and us Catholics, they all celebrated Mass every Sunday from the very beginning.

Also, we know **HOW** the first Christians celebrated the Mass, and their beliefs in the Real Presence of Jesus in the bread and the wine. Indeed, please google "**The First Apology of St. Justin, Martyr**" from 150AD, where St. Justin writes about the "**long tradition**" they had, in 150AD of how they celebrated Mass on Sundays...and it's just like we have Mass today. He says of the Body and Blood of Christ: "**This food we call Eucharist ...we do not receive these things as common bread or common drink; but as... the flesh and blood of... (our Savior) Jesus. (ch. 66).**"

So today, as we gather for Mass, let's remember that there is a power in knowing that we are **TRYING TO DO** and to be loyal to what those first Christians did.

Our Consecration to the Holy Family continues this week and finishes on Saturday, June 29th at the 5pm Mass. Please pray the prayer each day.


