HOLY FAMILY

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

June 29th & 30th

The Gospel reading from Luke 9, and the first reading from 1 Kings 19, seem to contradict one another today: For in 1 Kings we have a prophet, Elijah, calling someone to go and serve the Lord, someone named Elisha. But before he goes on a mission, Elisha wants to say goodbye to his father and mother, and Elijah has no problem at all with this. Elisha has a big feast for his family before he leaves to follow Elijah and to serve the Lord.

Then in the Gospel, we have Jesus criticizing people who want to do seemingly natural things for their family before leaving on a mission to serve the Lord and to follow Jesus. One wants to simply bury his deceased father, while another wants to only say goodbye to his family (like Elisha). But to these people Jesus is critical.

So what is going on here? Jesus often shocks us with language to wake us up. The message here today is to **"wake up"** and to realize the urgency of doing the work of the Lord in our lives. So often we get so overbooked by our other commitments that we even want to pull back from attending Mass...or from prayer...or from helping our neighbor in some way. Well, today Jesus is telling us to start putting the Kingdom of God first.

Do you think that Jesus would condemn us for taking care of the burial of a parent, really? Would God rebuke us for saying goodbye to our family before going to do volunteer work? I doubt it...but Jesus is telling us that He **KNOWS** that we put off doing the work of the Lord in our lives...and He wants us to start putting the Kingdom of God first.


