HOLY FAMILY

Dear Friends,

We are still praying for all those affected by violence around the world. In Orlando and Istanbul and so many other places. Let's remember those who are affected by this violence and also for those who put themselves at risk trying to make the world a safer place.

In the Gospel reading today, we hear Jesus respond to a **"scholar of the law"** who asked Jesus **"What must I do to inherit eternal life?"** Jesus says to him **"What is written in the law?"** the scholar says **"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."** Jesus then responds to the scholar of the law, **"You have answered correctly."**

In looking at this Gospel, one thing that is significant for us is that Jesus says that we shall love the Lord with **all of our mind, heart and strength**. Reminds me of what a retreat director said to us seminarians in my first year of seminary. He said, **"I can promise you'll find God and have a meaningful life if that is all that you want."** What the speaker meant was that if you really want to know God and to have the sense of meaning that comes from having God in your life and following the Lord, it can't be in second or third or fourth or fifth place in your life behind other things like the need for popularity or the need to be seen as important in the world, etc.
