On Thursday, July 6th I was diagnosed with Covid and began taking the medicine Paxlovid, which lessens the side effects of Covid. I isolated myself at the rectory for five days. As I write this note on Tuesday, I have recovered and I am resuming my regular schedule. I thank Fr. Patrick Monahan and Fr. Michael Torpey for celebrating the Vigil and Sunday Masses and Ric Massemei for leading the Communion Service on Friday, July 7th.

Although I could not attend because of contracting Covid, a group of 25 persons, including parishioners and staff members gathered last Sunday, July 9th in Unity Hall for the Sacred Presence Workshop. The workshop was the most recent step we have taken in creating a Strategic Master Plan for our parish. A group of parishioners began meeting back in January with Becki Kaman and Wayne Hipley of the Archdiocesan Office for Parish Mission.

This past Sunday was the first time for some of the parishioners to participate in our strategic planning process. As we move forward in formulating our Strategic Plan the circle of parishioners and staff members participating will continue to grow, ultimately including the entire parish community.

At the workshop participants shared stories of their involvement as disciples here at Holy Family and why they have chosen to be a member here at Holy Family. Many of them spoke of how our parish's participation in Winter Relief which provides shelter, meals, and hospitality for those persons who are homeless here in Anne Arundel County.

The goal of our Strategic Planning Process is to help parish staff members and each parishioner to become a more credible Disciple for Jesus Christ. Furthermore as a parish, our goal is to become more mission orientated and less of a maintenance oriented parish. The mission of our parish is to call, strengthen, equip, and send forth each parishioner to go make disciples for Jesus, which is the mission that the risen Christ gives to His disciples after His Resurrection (MT 28:19).





"Consubstantial" means "of the same substance" or "one in being," and describes the relationship that exists within The Blessed Trinity of God The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit. The term was first used in the early Church at the Council of Nicaea in 325 as part of the Nicene Creed, which we recite at Mass today.


