~ Pastor's Note ~

I have good news to share with you. Recently, our parish was awarded a grant of \$100,000 from the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention Program which has been created to assist Non-Profit Faith Based Organizations in preventing crime. This grant will help us to improve the security for our buildings and campus. I thank our staff members Louisa Woolery and Jean Phillips for working together with Kali St. Wyatt, who helped write our grant.

All of us have to be very careful these days of electronic financial fraud. If you ever receive a call, a text message on your phone or an email on your computer/ laptop advising you that your account has been electronically attacked, I suggest that you do not respond instantly. Instead, call your bank or credit card company on a secure line or email. You can find a verifiable phone number or email in your files or you can go personally to your bank or financial institution to confirm that the information concerning the purported hacking is correct. Otherwise, it could be a criminal contacting you and trying to gain access to your accounts and money. Please do not ever give out account numbers or passwords to your accounts over the phone or online unless you are certain that you know who you are talking with.

The work of installing the new HVAC System in our Church and on the ground floor below the Church is scheduled to begin on Monday, August 14th. While the installation work is taking place, we will celebrate Masses in the air conditioned Unity Hall beginning the weekend of August 19th & 20th. Daily Mass at 9am will be celebrated in our 1929 Sears - Roebuck mail order catalog Chapel beginning Wednesday, August 16th.

HVAC CAMPAIGN: As of July 23rd, we have received \$112,227.12. These gifts, combined with the \$50,000 from our reserve fund, gives us a total of \$162,227.12 or 26% towards our goal of \$630,000!

We are tracking our parish's progress in our HVAC Campaign with the two red thermometers in our narthex. The thermometers are on the two brick walls on the far right or left of the double doors that lead into our Church.

I thank all the parishioners who have contributed to our HVAC campaign and I ask all parishioners for their support. Every dollar given during this two year campaign is cathedraticum free, which means every dollar will go toward the purchase and installation of our new HVAC System.
