~ Pastor's Note ~

Over this Summer I have been examining our regular Sunday Mass attendance numbers from January 1st thru June 30th of this year. Aside from Easter Sunday, the number of persons attending the Saturday Vigil Mass and the three Sunday Masses ranged from a low of 690 persons to a high of 940 persons. Our attendance on most of the other Sundays was under 900 persons. According to fire regulations, our Church can legally seat 560 persons per Mass. Some years ago, Archbishop Lori wrote that a priest should not regularly celebrate more than three Masses on any given weekend (not including any possible funeral or wedding Masses).

Given our Mass attendance numbers, I have talked with parish leaders and staff members about the present Summer Mass Schedule becoming our regular Mass Schedule. I have consulted with our parish's two lay Corporators, members of our Parish Council, members of the Finance Committee, our leaders of Liturgical Music and staff members. The overwhelming majority of them agreed with me in keeping our current Summer Schedule of the 5pm Vigil Mass, the 8:30am Mass and the 10:30am Mass as our regular Sunday Schedule. Many of them told me that during this Summer they have appreciated celebrating Mass in our Church with more people attending each Mass.

I believe this new Sunday schedule of Masses will enrich our Celebration of the Eucharist.

I invite all Extraordinary Ministers (EMs) of the Eucharist and any persons desiring to serve in our parish in this ministry to attend one of the two training sessions being held in the Church this coming Tues., Aug. 8th or Wed., August 9th. Both sessions will begin at 7pm. At each session we will review procedures for sharing the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus at the upcoming Masses being celebrated in Unity Hall while our Church is closed due to our new HVAC System being installed

The work of installing the new HVAC System in our Church and on the ground floor below the Church is scheduled to begin on Monday, August 14th. While the installation work is taking place, we will celebrate Masses in the air conditioned Unity Hall beginning the weekend of August 19th & 20th. Daily Mass at 9am will be celebrated in our 1929 Sears - Roebuck mail order catalog Chapel beginning Wednesday, August 16th.

HVAC CAMPAIGN: As of July 30, we have received **\$117,523.12**. These gifts, combined with the \$50,000 from our reserve fund, gives us a total of **\$167,523.12** or **27%** towards our goal of **\$630,000**! We are tracking our parish's

progress in our HVAC Campaign with the two red thermometers in our narthex. The thermometers are on the two brick walls on the far right or left of the double doors that lead into our Church.

I thank all the parishioners who have contributed to our HVAC campaign and I ask all parishioners for their support. Every dollar given during this two year campaign is cathedraticum free, which means every dollar will go toward the purchase and installation of our new HVAC System. CARING FOR CREATION: Last week in our discussion about Weeds, I promised to talk about invasive species. As much as I'd like to talk about zebra mussels and mitten crabs, it's the plants that are on my radar today. For me English ivy is the number one offender. Their little tentacles will suck the life out of any tree it grows up. The sheer weight of the ivy

growing on the tree makes it top-heavy and subject to being blown over. The situation in which it might otherwise survive. If you see it growing on a tree in your yard along the road or any place, cut it off. You will be amazed how long it takes to die. It's not from around here. It's from Great Britain imported by our ancestors.

A little lower to the ground is another gem of an invasive plant called bush honeysuckle. Originally from Asia this plant invades quickly and outcompetes our native plants. You will typically find it along forest edges. Like many invasives, they emerge early in the Spring outgrowing and shading out our native plants. Along with English Ivy, the bush honeysuckle flowers in the Summer and come Fall the flowers will produce seeds. Next come the birds who will eat those seeds and then spread them throughout our community or up and down the East Coast as they migrate.

This fall I'd like to put a group together for a couple hours to remove some English ivy on the trees at the old Post Office property. Let me know if you would like to join me in this endeavor. Send me an email at <u>christophergordon@verizon.net</u>.


